

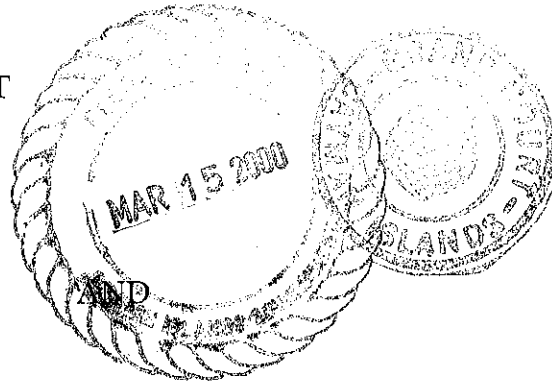

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET the Defendant, Danielle Lumby of #6 Forest Haven, George Town, Grand Cayman attend before the Judge in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 17 day of April 2000 at 9:30 o'clock in the forenoon on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff Nelson Dilbert of #6 Forest Haven, George Town, Grand Cayman that he be awarded custody of the child, Donovan Lumby whose date of birth is 7 November 1998.

AND LET the Defendant within 14 days of the service of the Summons on her counting day service and return accompanied acknowledgement of service to the Courts Office.

## NOTES

1. This Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (*or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months*) beginning with the above date unless renewed by order of the Court.
2. If a Defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place above mentioned such order will be made as the Court may deem just and expedient.

## IMPORTANT

Directions for Acknowledgement of Service are given with the accompanying form.

This Originating Summons was issued by Hunter & Hunter, Attorneys-at-Law for the Plaintiff, whose address for service is The West Wind Building, 2nd Floor, PO Box 190 GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

## DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

### *Notes for Guidance*

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Court's Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
5. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.


*Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.*

*Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.*
