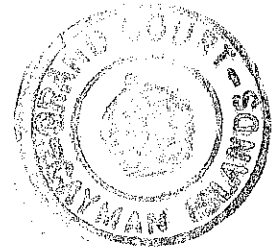
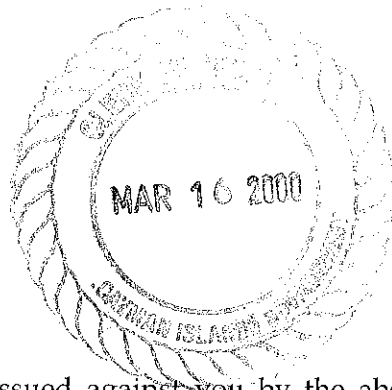

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiffs in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within Fourteen days [14] after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiffs may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiffs are the Joint Official Liquidators ("the Liquidators") of First Cayman Bank Ltd. (In Liquidation) ("the Bank"), whose address is P.O. Box 1113, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands. The Bank has at all material times has lent money to the Defendant.
2. The address of the First and Second Defendant is P.O. Box 625, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and both Defendants were beneficial owners of Things Caymanian Ltd. trading as Native Collections ("the Company"), which has now been struck off the Companies Register and was at all times the recipient of money loaned by the bank.
3. On or about the 19<sup>th</sup> day of November 1996 the bank agreed to lend the Company the sum of US\$47,439.69 and also extended an overdraft facility to the Company in the sum of CI\$10,000 on its CI Dollar current account and US\$10,000.00 on its US Dollar account. These facilities were subject to normal banking terms and conditions, including the right to repayment upon demand.
4. By a contract in writing dated the 26<sup>th</sup> day of November 1996 between the Bank and the Defendants, the Defendants agreed for the consideration therein set out to guarantee the payment on demand of all advances made by the Bank to the Company, including all interest, commission and banking charges thereon.
5. It was an express term of the said contract that the liability of each of the Defendants under the said guarantee should not exceed CI\$63,206.30, together with interest from the date of demand at the rate of the Bank's Best Lending Rate.
6. Pursuant to the said contract the Plaintiff made advances to the Company which, together with interest, commission and banking charges, amounted to CI\$10,000 in the form of an overdraft facility on its CI Dollar current account, US\$10,000.00 on its US Dollar account and US\$47,439.69 in the form of a loan. Deposits in the name of the

Defendants were applied to the outstanding balance as at 20<sup>th</sup> October 1997 as there were no repayments on either of the facilities since the closure of the Bank.

7. By letters in April and June 1998 from the Plaintiffs to the Defendants, the Plaintiffs demanded payment of the sums but neither the Defendants nor the Company have paid the said sum due or any part thereof.
8. The Company has repaid the Bank the total sum of US\$43,904.30 on account of the said loan:

9. Furthermore, the Company has repaid the Bank the sum of US\$4,258.69 on account of the said US Dollar overdraft facility.

10. The Company has repaid to the Bank the sum of CI\$3,050.02 on account of the said CI Dollar overdraft facility.



AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. The said sum of US\$18,757.14 being the outstanding balance including interest on moneys loaned to the Company by the Plaintiffs and guaranteed by the Defendants on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of December 1996, which remains due and owing ("the initial sum"). Further, the said sum of CI\$3,659.70 being the outstanding balance of an overdraft facility extended to the Company on its US Dollar account (converted to CI Dollars) and guaranteed by the Defendants including interest on or about the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1997 ("the second sum"). Further, the said sum of CI\$3,122.63 being the outstanding balance of an overdraft facility extended to the Company on its CI Dollar account and guaranteed by the Defendants, (including interest) on or about 20<sup>th</sup> October 1997 ("the third sum").
2. The Plaintiffs claim further interest on the said sums aforesaid from the date hereof until judgment or sooner payment at the daily rates of US\$5.14, US\$1.50 and CI\$1.28 respectively.
3. Alternatively the Plaintiffs claim pre-judgment interest pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 revision) as follows:
  - (i) On the initial sum at the rate of 7~~3~~% from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1996 to the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1998;
  - (ii) On the second sum at the rate of 7~~3~~% from the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1997 to the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1998;
  - (iii) On the third sum at the rate of 7~~3~~% from the 20<sup>th</sup> day of October 1997 to the 31<sup>st</sup> day of January 1998;

- (iv) At the rate of 7% on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of February 1998 to the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December 1998 on the initial sum, second sum and third sum;
  - (v) At the rate of 7% from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1999 to the date of this Writ on the initial sum, second sum and third sum.
4. Further and alternatively the Plaintiffs claim interest at the rate of 7% pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) from the date hereof until judgment or sooner payment.
5. Costs.

If within the time for returning Acknowledgment of Service the Defendants pays the total amounts claimed of US\$18,757.14, CI\$3,659.70 and CI\$3,122.63 (excluding the costs of any additional interest accruing) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the offices of the Plaintiffs' Attorneys-at-Law.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiffs (or on the Plaintiffs if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiffs may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
