

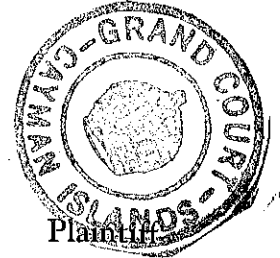

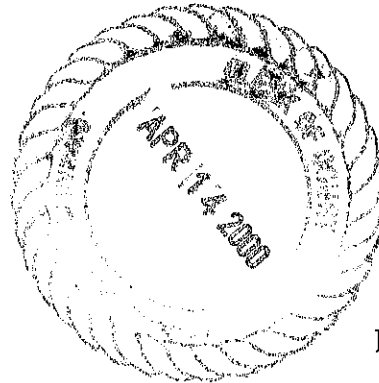

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

TO: William F. Polk of 1604 SW 5<sup>th</sup> Ct., Ft. Lauderdale, Florida U.S.A.  
the Chargor under the legal charge hereinafter mentioned

LET THE DEFENDANT, within 22 days after service of this Summons on him, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

BY THIS SUMMONS, which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, the Estate of Stanley Inkley, c/o Hunter & Hunter, The Huntlaw Building, 75 Fort Street, P.O. Box 190 GT, Grand Cayman, as the Chargee under the legal charge hereinafter mentioned, the Plaintiff seeks the following relief pursuant to section 77 of the Registered Land Law (1995 Revision), namely:

1. A declaration that the Defendant is in default in payment of the principal sum payable under a legal charge dated 1 July 1986 and made between the Defendant and his late wife and Stanley Inkley (deceased) ("the Charge"), by virtue of which property in the East End Registration Section Block 75 A Parcels 194, 195 and 196 ("the Property") was charged by the Defendant and his late wife by way of legal charge in favour of Stanley Inkley to secure repayment to Stanley Inkley (and following his death, by operation of law, to the Plaintiff) of the principal sum of CDN\$580,191.31 with interest at the rate specified in the schedule thereto and payable in accordance with the schedule thereto.
2. Delivery by the Defendant to the Plaintiff of possession of the Property.
3. An order that the Charge may be enforced by the sale by private treaty of the Property as well as by Public Auction.
4. Such further or other relief as the Court thinks fit.
5. Costs.

If the Defendants do not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to them as the Court may think just and expedient.
