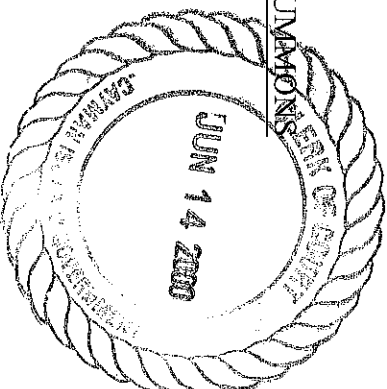

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within [14 days] after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P. O. Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 9th of June, 2000

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff claims C1\$4600.00 from the Defendant for overpayment of benefits for ex-servicemen and their widows.
2. Ms. Geris Rubena Martin was a recipient of benefits as the widow of a veteran. In May 1999 when the Government tried to inform Ms. Martin that she was to receive an increase in benefits they discovered that she was dead.
3. An error had been made on the death list of May 1997 and Ms. Martin's name had not Been included. As a result her name was not deleted from the Veterans Payroll at the time of her death and \$4,600.00 was overpaid into her account.
4. It was later learned that three names were on the widow's account. One of the names was that of the Defendant Lorna Bush daughter of Geris Martin..
5. Miss Bush knew that her mother Ms. Martin was deceased and that that the money was being paid to her mother as a widows benefit , however she still withdrew the money and has to date not returned it to the Government.
6. The Min. Co. Dev. Sports & Cu Department wrote to the Defendant requesting reimbursement.
5. The Treasury Debt Collector wrote to the Defendant on 28th,July,1999 requesting payment but this debt remains unpaid.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. The sum of C1\$4600.00.
2. Fixed cost of C1\$250.00, alternatively costs to be assessed.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.  
After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P. O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.
