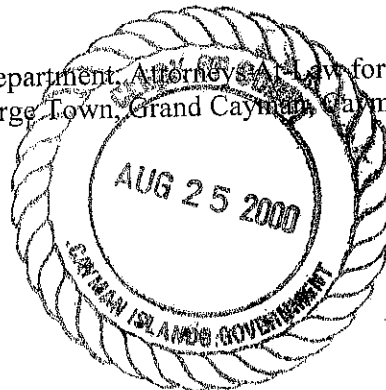
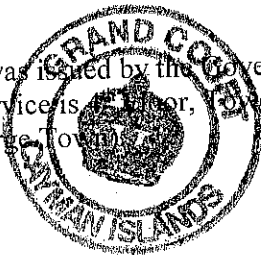

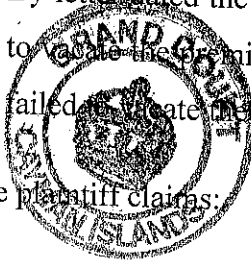

STATEMENT OF CLAIM


1. By lease registered on or around the 22nd. day of April, 1992, the plaintiff let to the defendant the premises described as Block 13EH, Parcel 5, in the George Town Central Registration Section for a term of 5 years from the 1st. day of January, 1992, at the annual rent of \$14,400.00. The defendant remained in occupation of the premises at the expiration of the 5 years set out in the lease.
2. Under the said lease, the defendant covenanted to pay the rent as stipulated in paragraph 1 above. The said lease, in clause 5, further provided that the plaintiff could re-enter and immediately terminate the tenancy where the rent was unpaid for more than 21 days after becoming due.
3. The defendant has failed to pay the rent due under the lease and the said rent is in arrears and the sum of \$19,500.00 is now due and outstanding as arrears of rent.
4. By letter dated the 2nd. day of March 2000, the plaintiff gave the defendant notice to vacate the premises within 1 month of the date of the letter. The defendant has failed to vacate the premises as requested by the plaintiff.

And the plaintiff claims:



1. Possession of the premises.
2. The sum of \$19,500.00 as arrears of rent together with interest thereon.
3. Costs.
4. Such further and or other relief as the Court considers necessary.
