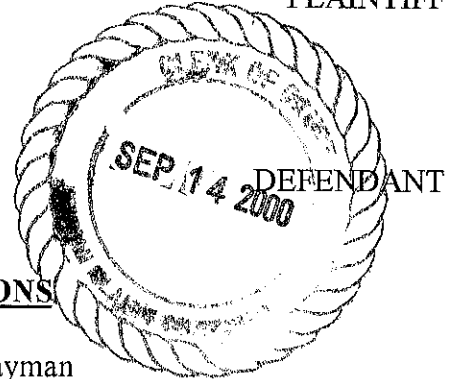

WRIT OF SUMMONS

TO: Daniel Dipre, PO Box 31843 SMB, Grand Cayman

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495 G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

PARTICULARS OF CLAIM


1. The Plaintiff has at all material times carried on the business of banking within the Cayman Islands including Credit Card Finance and has at all such times been the holder of a category "A" license under the Banks and Trust Companies Law (1995 Revision).
2. The Defendant has at all material times been a customer of the Plaintiff.
3. By an agreement in writing, referred to as the Cardholder Agreement ("the Agreement") the Plaintiff agreed to issue the Defendant with a credit-token, namely a credit card, upon the terms and conditions therein set out.
4. The Agreement provided, inter alia, that:
 - 4.1 Possession of the said credit card entitled the Defendant to obtain cash advances and/or to purchase goods or services upon production thereof to any supplier for the time being authorized by the Plaintiff, subject to an overall credit limit established by the Plaintiff from time to time;
 - 4.2 The Plaintiff would render to the Defendant monthly statements of account showing the balance owing on the account, such statements covering a period of between 28 to 33 days;
 - 4.3 The Defendant would have the option of paying such balance to the Plaintiff either (a) in full or, (b) by a part payment equal to the minimum payment as stipulated by the Plaintiff or (c) by any payment greater than (b);
 - 4.4 The Plaintiff would charge interest at the rate specified in a Disclosure Statement which accompanied the Agreement being 18% per annum of the outstanding balance or, on overlimits, 25% per annum of the said sum from the payment due date.
 - 4.5 The Defendant would pay to the Plaintiff all legal fees and expenses (on an Attorney-At-Law/Solicitor and client basis) incurred by the Plaintiff in recovering any indebtedness or interest and all expenses incurred by the Plaintiff in taking possession of the credit card;
5. Pursuant to the Agreement the Plaintiff rendered monthly statements to the Defendant showing the balance then due on the account, expressed in US dollars.
6. Despite the receipt of such monthly statements the Defendant has failed and/or neglected to pay the sums due in accordance with the payment provisions set out in paragraph 4.3 above. Alternatively, the Defendant has failed to pay any indebtedness exceeding the credit limit.

7. As a consequence of the Defendant's default, demand was made for payment of the sums due under the Agreement, by Ritch & Conolly, Attorneys-at-Law for the Plaintiff. The date of the demand was 14th August 2000 at which time the sum due under the Agreement was US\$2053.88.
8. Despite service of such demand, the Defendant has failed or neglected to discharge the sums due as aforesaid, together with interest.
9. Further, the Defendant is indebted to the Plaintiff in respect of a demand loan in the sum of CI\$6606.61 together with interest at the rate of 16% per annum.
10. The said indebtedness under the demand loan is repayable on demand. Such demand was made by the Plaintiff, through Ritch & Conolly, in the aforementioned demand letter dated 14th August 2000.
11. Despite such request, the said sum with interest remains due and owing.

AND the Plaintiff claims:

1. The sum of US\$2053.88 as referred to in paragraph 7 above;
2. Interest on the said sum from 14th August 2000 to the date hereof at the rate of 18% per annum being US\$17.22 and accumulating on the said sum until Judgment or sooner payment at the daily rate of US\$1.01;
3. The sum of CI\$6606.61 as referred to in paragraph 9 above;
4. Interest on the said sum from 14th August 2000 to the date hereof at the rate of 16% per annum being CI\$49.30 and accumulating on the said sum until judgement or sooner payment at the daily rate of CI\$2.90;
5. Costs.
