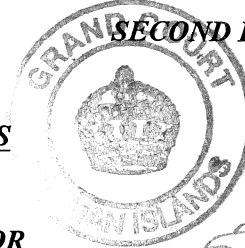

*THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS* has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within [14 days] after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service, stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

*If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.*

**STATEMENT OF CLAIM**

1. The Plaintiff was at all material times the owner of a 1999 Yamaha wave-runner valued at CI\$3,900.00, and resides in George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. The 1<sup>st</sup> Defendant has always and at all material times represented that he owned a Yamaha wave-runner and resides in George Town, Grand Cayman.
3. That the 2<sup>nd</sup> Defendant was at all material times an Auto-Mechanic residing in George Town, Grand Cayman.
4. That on or about January 2000 the 1<sup>st</sup> Defendant entered into an oral contract with the Plaintiff, whereby the Plaintiff agreed to exchange their respective wave-runners.
5. That on or around January 2000 the 2<sup>nd</sup> Defendant attended on the Plaintiff's residence and took possession of the wave-runner the Plaintiff had received pursuant to the oral contract set out in paragraph 4 above.
6. That in or around Jan 2001 the Plaintiff requested of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Defendant that either of the wave-runners be returned to him or that in the alternative that he be compensated in the sum of CI\$3,900.00 which represents the value of the wave-runner.
7. As of the date of the issuance of this writ, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Defendants have not returned the Plaintiff's wave-runner nor reimbursed the principal sum of CI\$3,900.00.
8. In addition to the principal sum due as set out above, the plaintiff is entitled to interest from the date of the agreement, the rate of interest being that established pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision). Interest of \$0000000 on the principal sum is also due as of the date of the issuance of this proceeding. The particulars of interest are as set out in the schedule attached to the Statement of Claim.

***AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:***

1. CI\$3,900.00 principal as pleaded above.
2. Pre-judgement and post-judgement interest upon the said principal pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgement Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules as prescribed from time to time; and.
3. Costs as taxed or agreed.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Defendants pays the total amount claimed of CI\$3,900.00 (excluding the costs of any additional interest accruing) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the offices of the Plaintiff's Attorney-at-Law.

**STATEMENT REGARDING INTEREST**

- i. The prescribed rate of interest from 1<sup>st</sup> Feb 2000 up to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2000 was 7 % per annum
- ii. The prescribed rate of interest from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2000 up to 26<sup>th</sup> Feb 2001 was 8 % per annum
- iii. The date from which interest accrues is from the date of the agreement as set out herein
- v. The total interest claimed as at the date of the issuance of this Writ of Summons is CI\$328.69
- vi. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of this Writ is \$2.54.

**SCHEDULE OF INTEREST CALCULATED**

- 1. Interest from 01/02/00 to 31/03/00 = \$3,900.00 x .07000 x 60/365 = \$44.90
- 2. Interest from 01/04/00 to 26/02/01 = \$3,900.00 x .08000 x 332/365 = \$283.79

## DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF WRIT OF SUMMONS.

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by The Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff ( or on the Plaintiff if acting in person ).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2 ), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgement is served on the Defendant.

If the defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgement against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgement is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of ( )" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as a ( )" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
