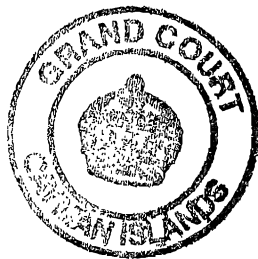

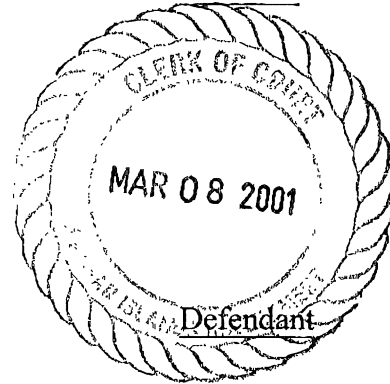

ORIGINATING SUMMONS


LET THE DEFENDANT of #59B Kennedy Road, George Town, attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the      day of 2001, at      o'clock in the      noon on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff of 28 Denison Street, Hartford Connecticut, United States of America, for the return of the child Samuel Solomon Williams to him in the United States.

1. The full name of the child in respect of whom this application is brought is Samuel Joseph Solomon Williams who was born on October 26, 1993.
2. The child's parents are Lantaben Williams and Carol Solomon.
3. The child is believed to be in the Cayman Islands with his mother, the defendant.
4. On the 7<sup>th</sup> August 1999, the defendant removed the said child from the country of habitual residence, the United States of America, without the knowledge and consent of the plaintiff.
5. The plaintiff's interest in the matter is that of father of the child and he seeks the return of the child based on the ground that the child was wrongfully removed from the United States in breach of his rights of custody which were being exercised at the time of removal.
6. At the time of the removal of the child, there was a Court Order prohibiting the defendant from removing the said child without providing the plaintiff with written notice 60 days prior by certified mail.
7. On 28<sup>th</sup> February, 2000, the plaintiff was granted custody of the said child by the Superior Court of the State of Connecticut.

8. On November 13, 2000, the plaintiff obtained a declaration from the Superior Court of Hartford, Connecticut, under Article 15 of the Convention on the Civil Aspects of International Child Abduction, set out in Appendix A to the Schedule to the Child Abduction and Custody (Cayman Islands) Order 1997, that the removal of the said child was wrongful in accordance with Article 3 of the said Convention.

By this summons the plaintiff seeks the return of the child to him forthwith and an order that the Defendant pay the costs of this application and any costs arising from an order to return the said child.
