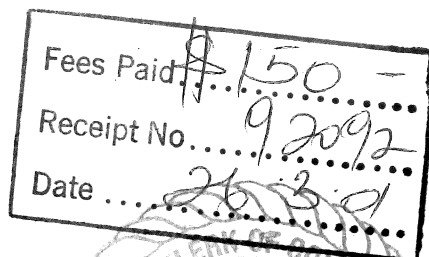

**APPLICATION FOR RESEALING GRANT OF LETTERS OF ADMINISTRATION
DE BONIS NON**

Succession Law, Section 23(1)

I, Lucille Anne Mortimer of Mississippi, U.S.A., being the Administrator De Bonis Non appointed by the Chancery Court of Harrison County, Mississippi, U.S.A., of the estate of the late Daniel J. Mortimer, Jr., surviving the deceased, being over the age of twenty-one- years and not having renounced Probate, which said Grant of Letters of Administration De Bonis Non was made on the 23rd February, 2001 and the said Grant of Letters of Administration De Bonis Non, together with the Certificate of Death, is annexed hereto, HEREBY APPLY for Resealing of the Grant of Letters of Administration De Bonis Non of the estate of Daniel J. Mortimer, Jr., and enclose my Affidavit in that behalf and undertake that in the event of a Resealed Grant being made to me and I will:-

- (a) within six months of the Resealed Grant of Letters of Administration De Bonis Non, I will prepare a true Inventory of the said estate in the Cayman Islands and exhibit and file the same in the Probate Registry; and
- (b) within one year of such Resealed Grant me I will have the assets comprising the said estate in the Cayman Islands administered according to the directions, if any, of the Court and file in the Probate Registry a general accounting for the whole of the assets of the said Cayman Islands estate.
