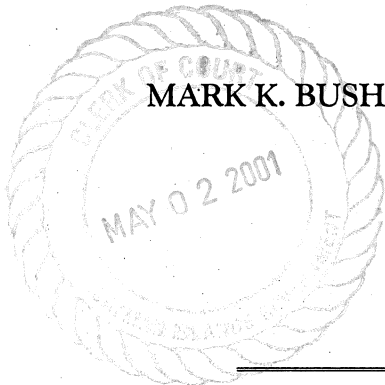

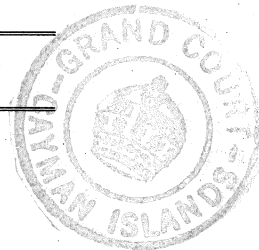

the Chargor under the legal charge hereinafter mentioned


LET THE DEFENDANT, within 14 days after service of this Summons on him, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

BY THIS SUMMONS, which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, Scotiabank (Cayman Islands) Ltd., Cardinal Avenue, P.O. Box 689 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, as the Chargee under the legal charge hereinafter mentioned, the Plaintiff seeks the following relief pursuant to section 77 of the Registered Land Law (1995 Revision), namely:

1. A declaration that the Defendant is in default of payment of the principal sum payable under the legal charge registered on 3 June 1998 ("the Charge") made between the Defendant and the Plaintiff, by virtue of which the property in the West Bay North West registration Section Block 1D Parcel 177 ("the Property") was charged by the Defendant by way of a legal charge in favour of the Plaintiff to secure repayment to the Plaintiff of the principal sum of CI\$5,000, with interest at the rate of 17% per annum payable in accordance with the schedule thereto.
2. Reasonable access to the Property by the Defendant to the Plaintiff, its employees and agents to allow for the valuation of the Property.
3. An order that the Charge may be enforced by the sale by private treaty of the Property (as well as by Public Auction).
4. Delivery by the Defendant to the Plaintiff of vacant possession of the Property on the sale of the Property by public auction or private treaty.
5. Such further or other relief as the Court thinks fit.
6. Costs.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.
