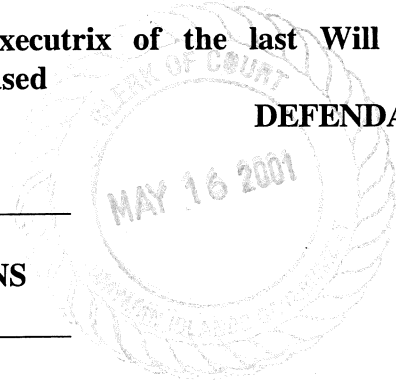

ORIGINATING SUMMONS


LET THE DEFENDANT of 69 Vibe Lane, West Bay, PO Box 1870, George Town, Grand Cayman attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman, on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of May 2001, at 1:30am/pm, on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff for the following orders and relief:

1. An order pursuant to Section 8 of the Succession Law (1995 Revision) (the "Succession Law") for the removal of the Defendant as Executrix of the Last Will and Testament of Cornelius Beukenkamp, Deceased, (the "Will"), forthwith.
2. An order pursuant to Section 7 of the Succession Law for the Defendant to file full accounts showing the receipts and distributions of the Testator's estate, duly supported by affidavit and for copies of the said accounts and affidavit to be served on the Plaintiff within 7 days from the date of an order herein.
3. An order pursuant to section 28(2) of the Succession Law for the registration of the Testator's home at Prospect, Grand Cayman into the name of the Plaintiff or as it may direct in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 9 and 11 of the Will.
4. An order THAT Christopher Johnson and Jeffrey Nason of PriceWaterhouseCoopers Cayman and Pennsylvania, US, be appointed as joint executors of the Testator's Will with immediate effect.

5. Any other orders or relief.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this summons on her counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Court's office

NOTES: (1) This Originating Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with that date unless renewed by order of the Court.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
