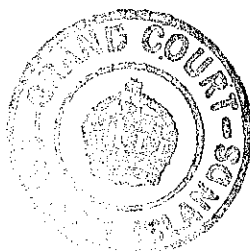
***If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.***

**STATEMENT OF CLAIM**

1. By agreement made between the parties the Plaintiffs let to the Defendant premises being Prospect Block 22E Parcel 76 at the rent of CI\$1,700.00 per month.
2. The Defendant failed to pay the rent as agreed between the parties and on or about the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 2001 the Plaintiffs had due to them from the Defendant rent totalling CI\$12,950.00.
3. The Plaintiffs on or about the 1<sup>st</sup> day of May 2001 gave the Defendant Notice to Quit the said premises.
4. That on a date unknown to the Plaintiffs the Defendant duly quit the said premises.
5. That at the date of so removing the Defendant was indebted to the Plaintiffs in the sum of CI\$12,950.00


6. The Plaintiffs have made repeated demands of the Defendant to pay the outstanding rents but the same remains due and owing.

***AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:***

1. The sum of CI\$12,950.00;
2. Interest at the Statutory rate;
3. Costs if any.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of \$13,988.61 (including interest and cost) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or their Attorneys-at-Law.

*Notes on address for service*

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an Attorney, state the Attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign Attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
