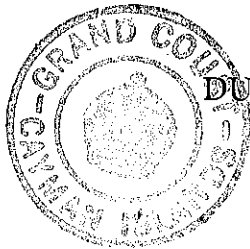

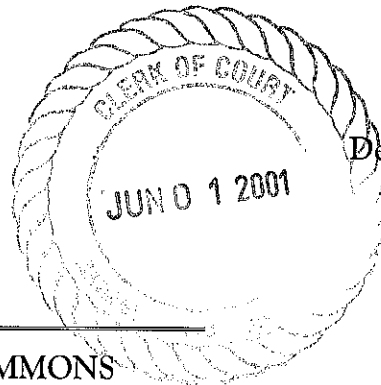

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

TO: Duken Campbell, 2008 Amber Leaf Place, Apt #36, Waldorf, Maryland 20602
the Chargor under the legal charge hereinafter mentioned

LET THE DEFENDANT, within 14 days after service of this Summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

BY THIS SUMMONS, which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, National Building Society Eastern Avenue, P.O. Box 504 GT, Unit 5, Capital Life Building Grand Cayman, as the Chargee under the legal charge hereinafter mentioned, the Plaintiff seeks the following relief pursuant to section 77 of the Registered Land Law (1995 Revision), namely:

1. A declaration that the Defendant is in default of payment of the principal sum payable under the Variation of Charge dated 18 September, 1997 ("The Charge") made between the Defendant and the Plaintiff, by virtue of which the property in the Lower Valley Registration Section Block 38B Parcel 438H3 ("the Property") was charged by the Defendant by way of a legal charge in favour of the Plaintiff to secure repayment to the Plaintiff of the principal sum of CI\$68,850.00 with interest at the rate of 4% per annum above the Plaintiff's Prime Lending Rate for Lending Cayman Islands Dollars in the Cayman Islands.
2. Delivery by the Defendant to the Plaintiff of possession of the Property.
3. An order that the Charge may be enforced by the sale by private treaty of the Property (as well as by Public Auction).
4. Such further or other relief as the Court thinks fit.
5. Costs.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service..
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.

7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
