

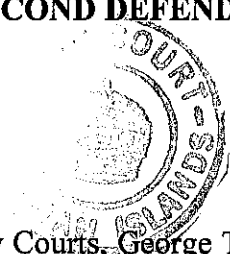

ORIGINATING SUMMONS



LET THE DEFENDANT attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the *9th* day of *May* 1996, at *3.30* ^{*PM*} o'clock on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff for an order:

1. That this Honorable Court do sanction and permit the Sale by Private Treaty by the Plaintiff of all that property registered in the Cayman Islands Land Register with absolute title and being particularly known as Registration Section George Town East Block 20E Parcel 310H55 ("the Property") as Chargee with a power of sale over the Property.
2. That the Defendants and any other person occupying the Property do, within 28 days of this Order, vacate the Property and take all appropriate steps to give the Plaintiff vacant possession of the Property.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this summons on her counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts office.

- (2) If a Defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place above-mentioned such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

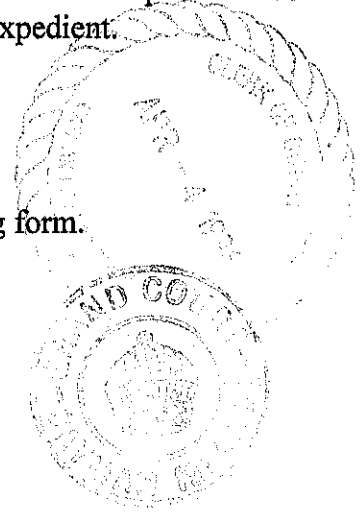
