**ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

**IMPORTANT NOTICE:** IT IS A CONTEMPT OF COURT, which may be punished by imprisonment, to take any child named in this Summons out of the Cayman Islands, without the leave of the Grand Court of the Cayman Islands.

**LET THE DEFENDANTS** within fourteen (14) days after service of this Summons upon them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form to the Courts Office at P.O. Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

BY THIS SUMMONS, which is issued on the Application of Geovanni Garro Piedra, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendants that:-

1. The above-named minor, **Geovanna Janelle Dominguez**, who is currently in the care and control of the Second Defendant, be made ward of this Honourable Court during her minority or until further order.
2. That the care and control of the said minor be committed to the Plaintiff and that the Defendants be strictly enjoined from removing the said minor out of the control of the Plaintiff until further order of this Honourable Court.
3. In the alternative, that the Plaintiff be granted custody, care and control of the minor child.
4. That the costs of this application be provided for.

The Plaintiff is the father of the minor.

The First Defendant is the mother of the said minor.

The date of birth of the minor is 23<sup>rd</sup> February, 1998.

The present whereabouts of the minor is that the minor is in foster care.

**IF THE DEFENDANTS DO NOT ACKNOWLEDGE SERVICE, SUCH JUDGMENT MAY BE GIVEN OR ORDER MADE AGAINST OR IN RELATION TO THEM AS THIS HONOURABLE COURT MAY THINK JUST AND EXPEDIENT.**

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

***Notes for Guidance***

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)."
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "*Partner in the firm of* (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.



**Notes on address for service**

*Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.*

*Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.*
