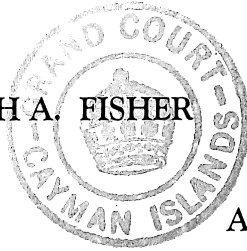

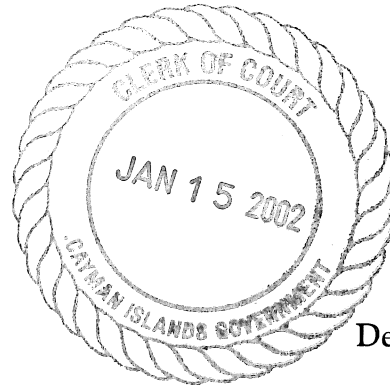

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WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 14 January 2002.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM


1. The Plaintiff is an individual residing in the Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant is an individual residing in the Cayman Islands and carries on business as "Scruples".
3. On or about 9 June 2001 borrowed the sum of CI\$5,000.00 from the Plaintiff.
4. The Defendant executed a promissory note in favour of the Plaintiff promising the payment of the said sum of CI\$5000.00. The Promissory Note terms included:
  - a. The promissory note was a demand note giving the Plaintiff to demand payment in full of the indebtedness;
  - b. Interest would be calculated at the rate of 8% per annum;
  - c. Payments on the loan would commence of 9 July 2001 to be made on a monthly basis.
5. By letter dated 13 December 2001 the Plaintiff, by her attorneys, made demand on the Defendant for full payment of all sums then due, being CI\$4,655.19 plus accrued interest.
6. The Defendant has failed to make full payment in accordance with the demand and the principal sum of CI\$4,514.03 is due as of the date of the commencement of this proceeding, inclusive of interest.
7. As a result of the above, the Plaintiff is entitled to the relief claimed in this proceeding.

### **AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS**

- i. CI\$4,514.03 being principal monies outstanding to the Plaintiff further to the above referenced promissory note as at 14 January 2002;
- ii. Interest pursuant to the promissory note at 8% per annum from the date of commencement of this proceeding;
- iii. Pre and post judgment interest of 8% per year pursuant to the promissory note as pleaded at paragraph 4 b above;
- iv. Alternatively, pre and post judgment interest pursuant to the Judicature Law, as amended and rules and regulations made pursuant to that Law.

- v. Costs assessed on an indemnity or standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001.
- vi. Such further and other relief as the Court may deem just.

If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the Defendants pay the total amount claimed (including interest and costs) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or her its attorney.

### INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$4,514.03 as principal and CI\$0.00 as interest until the issue of the writ of summons for a total amount of CI\$4,514.03. The amount of the costs claimed to the issuance of the writ of Summons is CI\$1,000.00 and the costs of issuing the writ of summons is CI\$150.00. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendant pays the plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal and interest, the fixed costs and the costs of issuing the writ of summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

### INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

(Order 6 (2) (e) of the Grand Court Rules)

- i. The contractual term upon which interest is claimed is as set out in paragraph 4 b, above;
- ii. The prescribed rate of interest during the entire relevant period from 9 July 2001 to the date of issuance of the proceeding is 8% per annum.
- iii. The total interest claimed as at the date of the issue of the writ of summons is CI\$0.00.
- iv. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of the writ is CI\$1.02.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If A Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communication for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.
