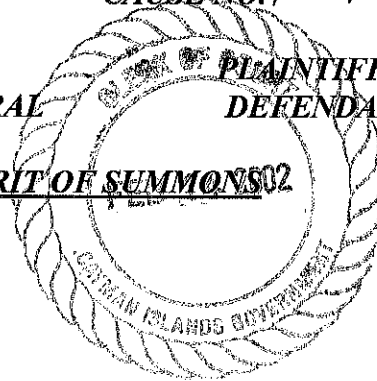

**THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS** has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within [14 days] after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service, stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

***If you fail to satisfy the claim or return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgement may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.***

**NOTE** - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

**STATEMENT OF CLAIM**

1. The Plaintiff is a licensed Medical Practitioner, who at all material times performed requested urological procedures on behalf of the Health Services Department of the Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant is made a party to these proceedings by virtue of and in accordance with the provisions of the Crown Proceedings Law in that the Health Services Department is an agent or servant of the Crown.
3. That between the years 1992 to December 1999 the Plaintiff was employed by the Health Services Department or its equivalent as its specialist in urology.
4. That in January 2000 the Plaintiff ceased his employment with the Health Services Department and commenced his practise as private practitioner.
5. That in the year 2000 the then Chief Medical Officer of the Health Services Department, Dr. Nick Harry, referred three patients to the Plaintiff in his capacity as a urologist in private practise, for the purpose of the Plaintiff providing urological services and carrying out urological procedures on the said patients, to wit: Jonathan Martin, Stephen Myers and Findley Ebanks.
6. The Plaintiff duly carried out the required urological procedures and services as requested and subsequently submitted his bills for payment.
7. The said Health Services Department, despite various demands for payment has refused and/or neglected to make the said payment and as a consequence the Plaintiff has suffered loss and damage.



***AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:***

1. The sum of CI\$6,678.00;
2. Interest thereon at the relevant Statutory rate;
3. Costs.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of \$7,643.00, including interest and cost, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or his Attorneys-at-Law.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
