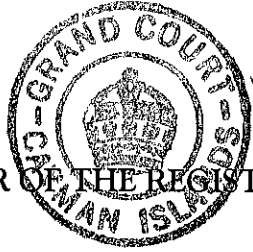


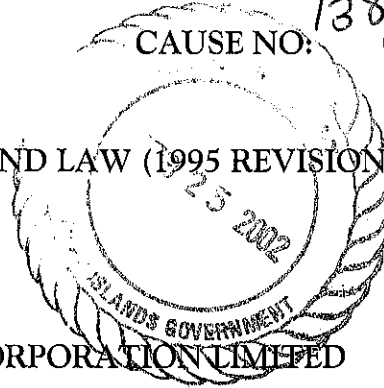

LET THE DEFENDANTS of 8 Stratton Drive, Huntington Station, New York, 11746, USA, attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 7 day of MAY 2002 at 9³⁰ o'clock in the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff of P.O. Box 1166 GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, that:


1. The Plaintiff, AALL Trust & Banking Corporation Limited at, P.O. Box 1166 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, as the Chargee under the legal charge registered against property described as Entry No. 7 and Instrument No. 3244/99 West Bay South Block 2C Parcel No. 131 H41, (the "subject property"), be granted the following relief pursuant to section 77 of the Registered Land Law (1995 Revision), namely:
 - a. A declaration that the Defendants are in default of payment of the principal sum payable under charge registered 08 April 1999, agreed upon between the Defendants and the Plaintiff, to repay Plaintiff the principal

sum of CI\$115,500.00, with interest at the rate of 9.75% per annum payable in accordance with the schedule thereto.

- b. An order granting leave to the Plaintiff to act upon a variation to the obligations set out in section 72 and section 75 of the Registered Land Law (1995 Revision) pursuant to the variation contained in the above stated charge;
- c. An order granting possession of the subject property;
- d. An order granting access to the Plaintiff for valuation, viewing and other relief as entitled pursuant to the charge;
- e. An order granting leave to sell the property by way of private treaty in addition to public auction and providing for particulars of a sale by private treaty as determined appropriate by the Court;
- f. Leave to apply further to the Court as may be required;

AND LET THE DEFENDANTS within 14 days after service of this summons on them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service Form to the Court Office.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Court's Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
5. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
