

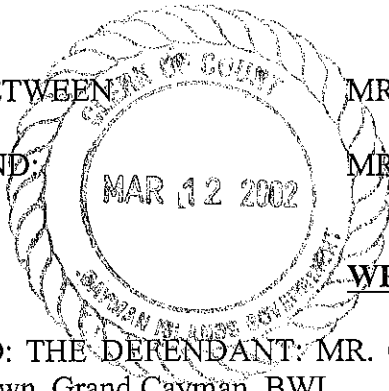

WRIT OF SUMMONS



TO: THE DEFENDANT: MR. CARLOS EUGENE MINZETT, Manse Road, Bodden
Town, Grand Cayman, BWI.

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 12 day of March 2002

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is and was at all material times the owner and entitled to possession of the property known as 13 Magpie Close, Cumber Avenue, Bodden Town, Grand Cayman, BWI (the "property").
2. On or about 13 January 2002 the Plaintiff was at her home. Also there was Ms. Rose Frederick. Earlier that evening Ms Rose Frederick left the property and whilst returning home at or about 2.00 a.m. and without provocation was assaulted by the Defendant who caused her to suffer personal injuries. The assault was reported to the police who attended the scene immediately. Ms. Rose Frederick was taken to George Town Hospital for her injuries.

PARTICULARS OF INJURY

Ms. Rose Frederick's date of birth is 27 January 1964. She was punched repeatedly to her face and body. She had bruising to the left cheek and frontal region of the left scalp, a 1 cm laceration to the lip as well as other injuries. She has provided us with a copy of her medical report of Dr. S. Teeling dated 19 January 2002 which is served herewith.

3. On 13 January 2002 at or about 9.00 p.m. the Defendant without the consent of the Plaintiff entered the property. The Defendant refused to leave the property and the Plaintiff telephoned the police. He proceeded to verbally abuse and threaten the Plaintiff. The police attended the scene and arrested the Defendant and a report dated 13 January 2002 was prepared recording the incident
4. By reason of the matters aforesaid the Plaintiff has suffered trauma and is in fear that she will be assaulted.

PARTICULARS OF INJURY


The Plaintiff's date of birth is 17 September 1928 and she is 73 years old. She is in fear of her safety and has suffered great anguish and mental distress.

5. The Defendant repeatedly attends the property against the wishes of the Plaintiff. On or about 11 March 2002 the Defendant entered the property of the Plaintiff through a window and proceeded to damage the property by pouring milk over the floor and furniture in a bedroom.
6. The Plaintiff also claims an injunction restraining the Defendant whether by himself or by his servants or agents or otherwise howsoever from doing the following acts or any of them namely molesting, assaulting, annoying or otherwise interfering with the Plaintiff and or her family by telephoning or by calling on them at any place whatsoever or by writing to them or by following or accosting any of them in any place whether public or private.

2. The Defendant threatened and intends unless restrained by this Honourable Court from so doing to act or continue to act namely molesting, assaulting, annoying or otherwise interfering with the Plaintiffs and or her family by telephoning or by calling on them at any place whatsoever or by writing to them or by following or accosting any of them in any place whether public or private.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. An injunction restraining the Defendant whether by himself or by his servants or agents or otherwise howsoever from doing the following acts or any of them namely molesting, assaulting, annoying or otherwise interfering with the Plaintiff and or her family by telephoning or by calling on them at any place whatsoever or by writing to them or by following or accosting any of them in any place whether public or private.
2. A penal notice to be endorsed on the Order or Injunction
3. Damages and interest thereon pursuant to the said statute.
4. Aggravated damages
5. Costs
