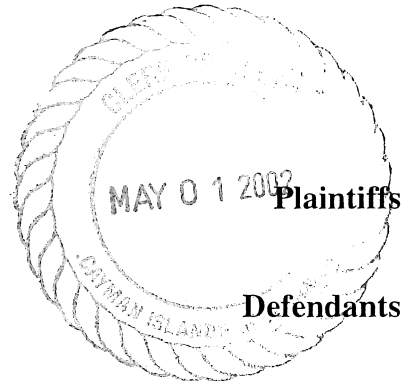

LET THE DEFENDANTS, within 14 days after service of this Summons upon them, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form to the Court Office, PO Box 495 GT George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of the Plaintiffs (1) Mansour Ojje, (2) Jean de Roquefeuil, (3) Abdulaziz Ojje, all c/o Maples and Calder, Uglan House, P.O. Box 309 GT, Grand Cayman who are all trustees of the above mentioned Trust (the "Trust") (the Plaintiffs Mansour Ojje and Abdulaziz Ojje, also being beneficially interested thereunder), the Plaintiffs seek the following Orders:

1. directions whether the Plaintiffs as trustees of the Trust should defend at the expense of the Trust any proceedings which may be issued in order to prosecute the claims referred to in the Letter before Action on behalf of Mme. Nahed Ojje and her son Akram Ojje intended to be exhibited to these proceedings, or other claims which may be made arising out of or otherwise connected with the allegations made in the said Letter.

2. that all further and necessary orders and directions may be given, including representation orders, as the Court shall think fit.
3. that provision be made for the costs of this Summons.
4. further and/or other relief.

If the Defendants do not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to them as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495 GT George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
