
1. That the Defendants be restrained from taking, or causing IG Services Limited to take, any steps in proceedings brought by Len B. Blackwell on behalf of IG Services Limited (in liquidation) against the Second Plaintiff herein in the United States Bankruptcy Court, Western District of Texas, San Antonio Division, under Adversary Proceeding number 02-5061-C:

- (a) generally until further order, alternatively
- (b) pending the final determination of the proceedings brought by Filemon Garza Gutierrez and others individually and on behalf of a proposed class of IG Services Limited's clients against, among others, the Plaintiffs herein in the District Court of Bexar County, Texas, United States of America, 224th Judicial District, Cause No. 2000-CI-08976, alternatively
- (c) pending a further review of the stay on the first available date following the expiry of one year from the hearing date of this Originating Summons, alternatively
- (d) until such time as the court thinks fit.

2. That the costs of and occasioned by this Summons be borne by the Defendants.

AND LET THE DEFENDANTS within 14 days after service of this summons on them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.
