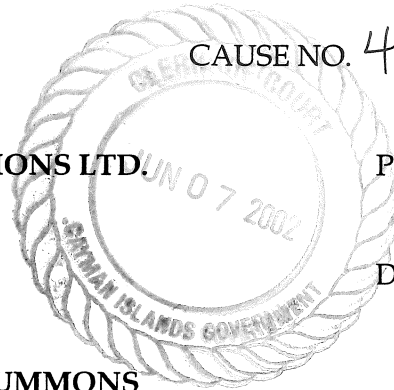

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

To: John P. Collins of 76 Woodlands Drive, Savannah, Grand Cayman, the person against whom the Charging Order hereinafter mentioned was obtained

LET the Defendant, within fourteen (14) days after service of this Summons on him, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495 G, George Town, Grand Cayman

By this Summons which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, Over-C Business Solutions Ltd., of P.O. Box 30185 SMB, Grand Cayman, a judgment creditor entitled to the benefit of the Charging Order, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendant:


1. An account of what is due to the Plaintiff from the Defendant under and by virtue of a Charging Order absolute dated 27 May 2002 and made in proceedings the short title and reference to the record whereof is "Cause No. 272 of 2002, Over-C Business Solutions Ltd. v. Collins", whereby the property known as West Bay North East Block 9A, Parcel 18REM1 was charged with the payment to the Plaintiff of US\$42,080.46, the amount due pursuant to an Order dated 12 February 2001, and interest thereon at the statutory rate together with the costs of the application for the Charging Order.
2. An order that the Charged Property may be sold and that the money to arise by such sale be applied in discharge of what shall be due to the Plaintiff under the said Charging Order and for its costs of this action, and any surplus be paid to the Defendant.

3. Further or other relief.

4. Costs.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
