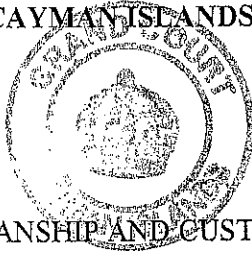

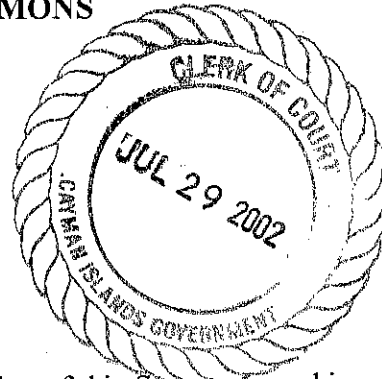

LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this Summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service form to the Courts Office, P.O Box 495 George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of Angelica Montero of Apartment #2, Theresa Drive, Windsor Park, George Town, the Plaintiff seeks the following Orders that:

1. She may be granted custody of the minor children Aaliyah Montero and Jerome Montero pursuant to the Guardianship and Custody of Children Law .
2. That the Defendant or whether by his servants and/or agents, be restrained from harassing, molesting or assaulting or otherwise interfering with or accosting the Plaintiff, with penal consequences in the event of a breach.
3. That the Defendant be restrained by himself his servants and/or agents or otherwise from removing or attempting to remove the said minors from the care custody and control of the Plaintiff, or from the Jurisdiction or otherwise without the express consent of the Plaintiff.

4. That there be no order for access to the children, unless expressly agreed to with the Plaintiff.
5. That the Defendant do pay to the Plaintiff, such periodical payments as the court deems just, for the maintenance of the said minor children.
6. That the Defendant do pay the costs of this application.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

**Notes on address for service**

Attorney: Where the Defendant is represented by an Attorney, state the Attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign Attorney.

Defendant in person: Where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant ( if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service form and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purposes of calculating the period of 14days for acknowledging service, a summons served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the defendant is sued in a mane different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words" sued as (*the name stated on the Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition of paragraph 1 of the description " Partner in the firm of \_\_\_\_\_ - " after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN , the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description " trading as \_\_\_\_\_ " after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an attorney or someone authorised to act on behalf of the company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
