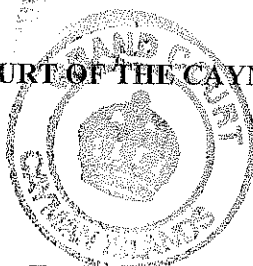

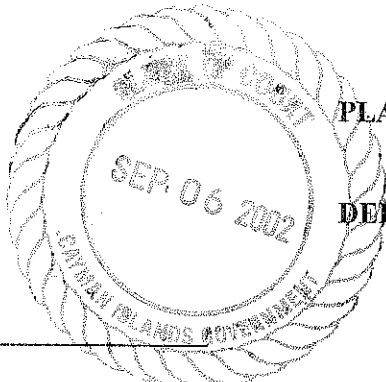

WRIT OF SUMMONS

TO: Dante Peirano of San Lucar 1574, Montevideo, Uruguay

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this day of September, 2002.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court

STATEMENT OF CLAIM


1. The Plaintiff is a company incorporated in March 1988 under the laws of the Cayman Islands and has carried on banking business since October 1988 when it was granted a category "B" banking licence under the Banks and Trust Companies Law.
2. The Plaintiff is substantially owned by the Velox group of companies (the "Group") which comprises a number of banking, financial, investment and food retail businesses. Ultimately the Group is owned or held for the benefit of the Peirano family, based in South America, of which the First and Second Defendants are members.
3. The Plaintiff carried on banking business and accepted deposits from customers most of whom were resident in Paraguay, Argentina, Uruguay and Chile.
4. On 5th July 2002, a petition was presented to the Grand Court for the winding up of the Plaintiff. On the same date, provisional liquidators were appointed over the Plaintiff. On 29th August 2002 a winding up order was made against the Plaintiff.
5. The latest financial records for the Plaintiff indicate that the sum of US\$132,865.77 is due and owing from the Defendant to the Plaintiff:

6. The Plaintiff claims such sums from the Defendants and claims interest thereon from the date hereof pursuant to Section 34 Judicature Law at the rate of 6¼% amounting to US\$5,561.50 to the date hereof and accruing at the daily rate of US\$22.70 until judgment or sooner payment.
7. The Plaintiff claims costs.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. The said sum of US\$132,865.77.
2. Interest on the aforementioned sums pursuant to Section 34 Judicature Law, amounting to US\$5,561.50 to the date hereof and continuing to accrue at the total daily rate of US\$22.70 from the date hereof until judgment or sooner payment.
3. Costs.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE

OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.
