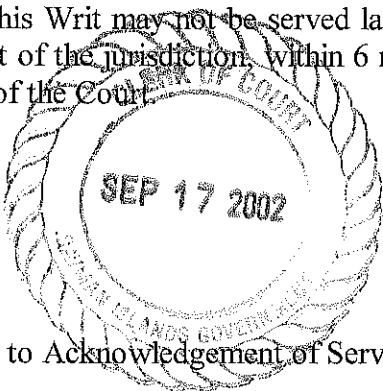
THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above named Plaintiff in respect of claim set out in the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days of service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P. O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings

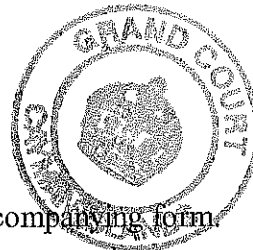
If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 17th September, 2002.

NOTE: This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, within 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by the order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The plaintiff is a church school.
2. The defendants are parents of Cruz and Monique Barnett.
3. On the 28th August, 1995, the defendants signed an agreement with the plaintiff to have their child, Nigel, and later, on the 25th January, 2000, another agreement to have two other children, Nuriel and Nevil educated at the said plaintiff and agreed to pay the fees upon presentation of the bills. In breach of the agreements, the fees went into arrears in the sum of \$4,644.26 and when called upon to pay, removed the children from the school, leaving the bill unpaid.
4. Despite several demands the defendants have failed to pay the sum due.

In addition to the principal sum of \$4,644.26 due to the plaintiff, it is entitled to interest from 17th September, 2001 at the rate of interest at the rate of 4.5% per annum. Interest on the principal sum is also due as of the date of the issuance of these proceedings until payment. The particulars of interest are set out in the schedule attached to the Statement of Claim.

Wherefore the plaintiff prays that the defendant be ordered to pay:

1. Principal sum =\$4,644.26
2. Interest at 4.5% p.a. from 18th September, 2001 until payment
3. Costs to be taxed or agreed

INDORSEMENT

The amount claimed in respect of the debt is \$4,644.26 as principal and as interest until the issue of the Writ of Summons for a total of **\$4,644.26**. The amount of fixed costs is \$250.00 and the cost of issuing this Writ of Summons is \$150.00. If within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service the defendants pay the plaintiff's attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal and interest, the fixed costs of issuing of the Writ of Summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff's attorneys-at-law at the NevLaw Building, 180 Shedden Road.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If A Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
