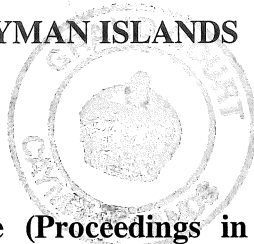

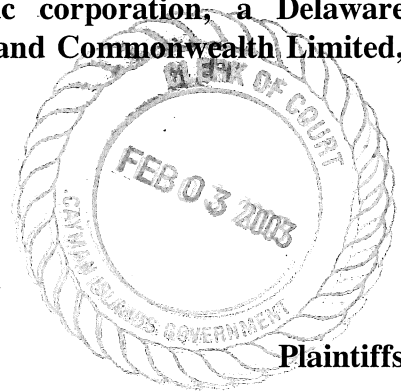

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE DEFENDANT, D Scott McGregor of Apartment No. 14, Cayman Reef Resort, Grand Cayman ("Mr McGregor"), attend before the Judge in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town on the 19 day of February, 2003 at 9.30am on an application by the Plaintiffs, Spivak Management Inc, a California corporation and Telemac corporation, a Delaware corporation both of 6701 Centre Drive, Suite 700, Los Angeles, California 90045-1535 for the following orders:

1. A commissioner be appointed for the purpose of taking the evidence of Mr McGregor in accordance with the Letter of Request issued by the United States District Court for the Central District of California;
2. Mr McGregor do produce to the Commissioner the documents described in Schedule B to the Letter of Request;
3. Mr McGregor do attend at the offices of Maples and Calder, Uglan House, George Town, Grand Cayman on a date to be fixed by the Commissioner for the purpose of being cross examined by counsel for the plaintiffs upon the matters described in Schedule A to the letter of request and upon the content of his declaration made on 13<sup>th</sup> December, 2002 and being re-examined by the Counsel for the defendants, Lowell Snow and Commonwealth Limited; and
4. Such further or other orders and directions as the Court think fit.

And let Mr McGregor within 14 days after service of this summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying acknowledgement of service to the Courts office.

NOTES: (1) This Originating Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with that date unless renewed by order of the Court.

(2) For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
