

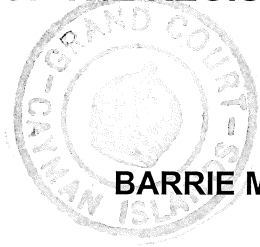

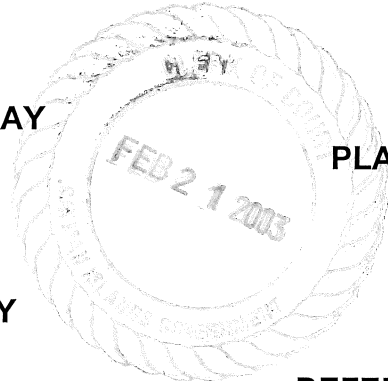

**ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

That the property registered in the joint names of the parties situate in Tropical Gardens off Crewe Road, George Town, Grand Cayman, and more particularly, described as Registration Section Prospect, Block 22E, Parcel 122 be placed on the market for sale and the net proceeds be divided equally between the parties.
2. Such other Order as the Court deems just and expedient

**AND LET THE DEFENDANT** within fourteen (14) days after service of this Summons on her, counting the day of service return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office.

**NOTES:**

1. This Summons may not be served later than four (4) calendar months (or if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, six (6) months) beginning with the above date renewed by order of the Court.
2. If a Defendant does not attend personally or by her Attorney at the time and place above-mentioned, such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

## **DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 494 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

### **Notes for Guidance:**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purposes of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words 'sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons).
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of ( )" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as ( )" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company,. but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
