THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a company organized and carrying on business under the laws of the Cayman Islands and has its registered office at PO Box 72 GT.
2. The Defendant is an individual residing in the Cayman Islands with a mailing address of PO Box 11548 APO, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.
3. In consideration for the Plaintiff providing goods the Defendant endorsed to the Plaintiff a cheque for CI\$1,950.00 dated 14 June 2000 payable to her and drawn on Cayman National Bank Account # 01-514-402235-01 maintained by A & C Construction. CNB did not honour that cheque upon presentment and it was returned to the Plaintiff.
4. In consideration for the Plaintiff providing goods the Defendant wrote a cheque to the Plaintiff on 20 December 2000 in the amount of CI\$1,950.00 drawn from the Royal Bank of Canada with account number 511-909-4. The bank did not honour the cheque on presentment stating that the account was closed. The cheque was returned to the Plaintiff.
5. Notwithstanding the delivery by post of a Notice of Dishonour, the Defendant has not made payment to the Plaintiff of the dishonoured cheques.
6. The total principal amount outstanding by the Defendant to the Plaintiff as of 21 March 2003 is CI\$3,900.00.
7. The Plaintiff claims interest from the date of presentation of the dishonoured cheques, 20 December 2000, at the rate as determined the Judicature Law (2002 Revision) and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time
8. As a result of the above, the Defendant is liable to the Plaintiff in the sums as set out in this Statement of Claim.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- a) CI\$3,900.00 being principal due to 21 March 2003;
- b) Pre-and post-judgment interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time;
- c) Costs on an indemnity basis or, alternatively, standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001;
- d) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just;

## INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$3,900.00 and interest as of the date of commencement of the proceeding is CI\$391.39 for a total amount of CI\$4,291.39. The amount of the filing fees to commence the proceeding is CI\$150.00. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendant pays the plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal, interest, and the costs of issuing the writ of summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

### INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

(Order 6 (2) (e) of the Grand Court Rules)

- i. Interest is 4.5 % per month in accordance with the Judicature Law (2002 Revision) and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time as claimed in the Statement of Claim, above.
- ii. The prescribed rate of interest during the entire relevant is 4.5 % per month;
- iii. The date from which interest runs is 20 December 2000.
- iv. The total interest claimed as at the date of the issue of the writ of summons is CI\$391.39.
- v. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of the writ of summons is CI\$0.4808 per day;

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his *Acknowledgment of Service* that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If A Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the *Acknowledgment of Service*, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his *Acknowledgment*, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
