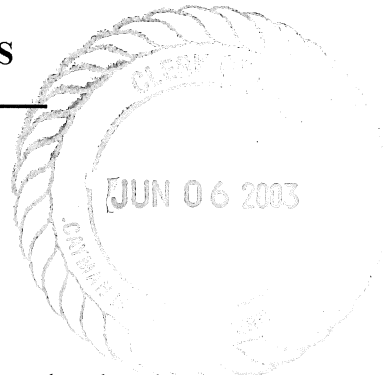

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE: This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issued unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. By a written agreement dated, 8th October 1996 the Defendant employed the Plaintiff as a Marketing and Sales Administrator.
2. It was an express term of the agreement that the Plaintiff would receive 5% commission on all products sold.
3. In furtherance of the above agreement the Plaintiff negotiated the sale of US\$ 137,380.78 worth of goods to the Cayman Islands Government on behalf of the Defendant. The sale was completed on or about the 18th of September 1997.
4. Despite the Plaintiffs demands and in breach of the above agreement the Defendant has refused or otherwise failed to pay the commission due on the above amount namely, US\$ 6,869.04.
5. In addition to the principal sum of US\$ 6,869.04 the Plaintiff claims interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules. The total interest as of the 6th of June 2003 amounts to US\$ 2,618.28

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. US\$ 6,869.04 due under the agreement;
2. Pre-judgment and post-judgment interest as prescribed by the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rates of Interest) Rules. The total interest as of the 6th June 2003 amounts to US\$ 2,618.28 increasing at a per diem rate of US\$ 0.85; and
3. Costs.

This Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim is filed by Broadhurst DaCosta, Attorneys-at-Law for the Plaintiff, whose address for service is 40 Linwood Street, P.O. Box 2503 GT Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

INDORSEMENT

The amount claimed in respect of the debt is US\$ 6,869.04 as principle and US\$ 2,618.28 as interest as of the 6th of June 2003 for a total amount of US\$ 9,487.32 and increasing at per diem rate of US\$ 0.85. The amount of the fixed costs is CI\$ 250.00 (US\$ 304.88) and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons is CI\$ 150.00 (US\$ 182.93). If within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the Plaintiff or its Attorneys-at-Law the total amount claimed in principal and interest, the fixed costs and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or to its Attorneys-at-Law.

STATEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

1. The date at which the interest became payable was the 18th of September 1997.
2. The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest Rules) was 7.375% from 1997 to January 31, 1998. There were 136 calendar days during this period. This amounts to a total interest for this period of US\$ 189.04.
3. The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest Rules) was 7.875% from February 1, 1998 to December 31, 1998. There were 338 calendar days during this period. This amounts to a total interest for this period of US\$ 500.24.
4. The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest Rules) was 7% from January 1, 1999 to March 31, 2000. There were 455 calendar days during this period. This amounts to a total interest for this period of US\$ 600.60.
5. The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest Rules) was 8% from April 1, 2000 to May 31, 2001. There were 426 calendar days during this period. This amounts to a total interest for this period of US\$ 643.26.
6. The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest Rules) was 6.25% from June 1, 2001 to November 30, 2001. There were 183 calendar days during this period. This amounts to a total interest for this period of US\$ 215.94.
7. The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest Rules) was 4.5% from December 1, 2001 to May 9, 2003. There were 524 calendar days during this period. This amounts to a total interest for this period of US\$ 474.20.

8. The total amount of interest claimed pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debts (Rate of Interest) Rules as of May 9, 2003 is US\$ 2,618.28.
9. This total interest is increasing at a per diem rate of US\$ 0.85.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2). The defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen (14) days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
