

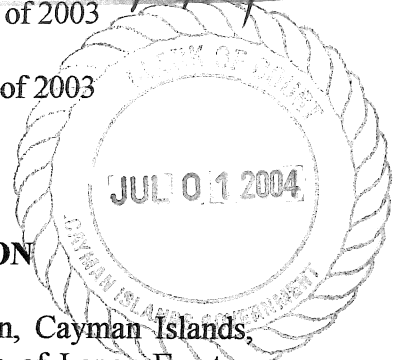

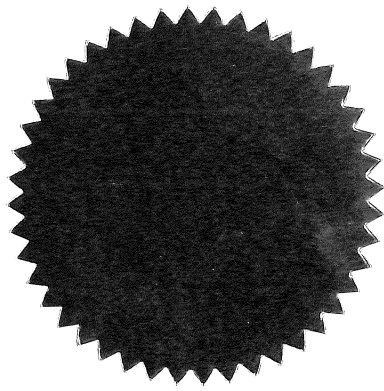
**AND I DECLARE** myself bound unto the Financial Secretary of the Cayman Islands in the amount of CI\$78,000.00.
