

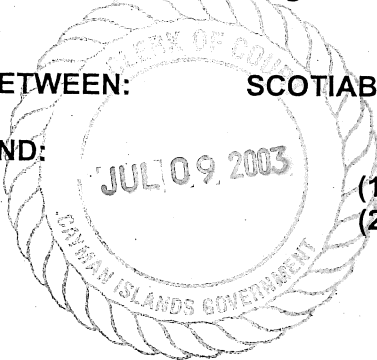

1. THAT this Honourable Court do sanction and permit the sale by private treaty of all that land and property registered in the Cayman Islands Land Register and known particularly as Registration Section George Town East Block 20D Parcel 257, (the "First Property") and George Town Central Block 14 CF Parcel 14, ("the Second Property"), by the Plaintiff as Chargee with a power of sale over the First Property and Second Property.
2. THAT the Defendant and any other person/s occupying the First Property and Second Property do, within 28 days of this Order, vacate the First Property and Second Property and take all appropriate steps to give the Plaintiff vacant possession of the Property.
3. THAT this Honourable Court do give directions with regard to the price for the sale of the Property.
4. Such further or other relief as this Honourable Court may deem appropriate.

LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days of this Summons on each of them, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
