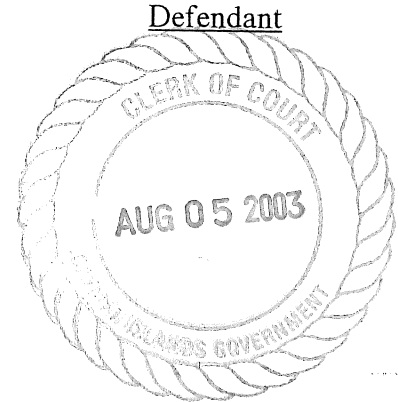

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE: This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issued unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a Cayman Islands company with its registered office situated at P.O. Box 1152GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands doing business at all material times as a department store.
2. The Defendant is a Cayman Islands company with its registered office situated 1A Regal House, North Church Street, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands doing business at all material times as a construction company.
3. By an oral Agreement, evidenced in writing on 10 September 2002, the Plaintiff agreed to supply and sell and deliver a quantity of work boots (the, "Boots") to the Defendant particulars of which appear immediately below.

4. In pursuance of the said Agreement the Plaintiff delivered the Boots to the Defendant.
5. In breach of the Agreement, the Defendant has failed and or otherwise refused to pay the price of CI\$ 4,892.00 or any part thereof.
6. In addition, the Plaintiff also claims pre-judgment and post-judgment interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (as Revised) and the Judgment Rates of Interest) Rules amounting to CI\$ 167.40 and increasing at a per diem rate of CI\$ 0.60.
7. The Plaintiff and its Attorneys-at-law have written demand letters to the Defendant which the Defendant has ignored.

The Plaintiff claims:

1. CI\$ 4,892.00

2. Pre-judgement and post-judgment interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (as Revised) and the Judgment Rates of Interest) Rules amounting to CI\$ 167.40 and increasing at a per diem rate of CI\$ 0.60.
3. Costs to be assessed if not agreed.

This Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim were issued by Broadhurst DaCosta, Attorneys at Law for the Plaintiff whose address for service is P.O. Box 2503 GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

INDORSEMENT

The amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$ 4892.00 as principle and CI\$ 167.40 as interest as of 4th August 2003 for a total of CI\$ 5059.40 increasing at a per diem rate of CI\$ 0.60. The amount of the fixed costs is CI\$ 250.00 and the cost of issuing the Writ of Summons is CI\$ 150.00. If within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the Plaintiff or its Attorneys-at-Law the total amount claimed as principal and interest, the fixed costs and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons further proceedings will be stayed.

STATEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

The prescribed rate of interest pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revised) and the Judgement (Rates of Interest) Rules was 4.5% between the period of 29th October 2002 and the 4 August 2003. There were a total of 279 calendar days during that period. The total amount of interest for the period is CI\$ 167.40. This amount is increasing at a per diem rate of CI\$ 0.60.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2). The defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.
3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgement is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen (14) days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
