THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court office, P.O. Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (*or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months*) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Petitioner lives in a house with a garden located at 110, Yellowstone Road, Newlands, Grand Cayman where she has resided at all material times.
2. The Petitioner's children Gina and Gino aged 4 and 9 respectively live with the Petitioner and attend Triple C School, Grand Cayman.
3. On 27 July 2003 the Defendant, uninvited, called at the Petitioner's home and accused her of having an affair with the Defendant's husband and was verbally abusive, refused to leave and thereafter assaulted and battered the Petitioner by striking the Petitioner. She then proceeded to throw stones at the Petitioner's house, banged on the door, entered the property again and was verbally abusive towards the Plaintiff in front of her children. The Plaintiff called the police and the Defendant made to the police in earshot of the Plaintiff a threat to kill.
4. Between the 27 July 2003 and the 11 September 2003 the Defendant has telephoned the Plaintiff on two occasions at home late at night and on two occasions at work and she has been verbally abusive to the Plaintiff and thereby harassing her and causing her distress.
5. The Plaintiff attended the Triple C School on the afternoon of 11 September 2003 to collect her children. The Defendant's children attended the same school and the Defendant deliberately drove her motor vehicle up to the Plaintiff and in front of the Plaintiff's children was threatening and verbally abusive.
6. By reason of the said assault and battery, harassment and pestering, the Plaintiff has suffered physical pain and in particular mental distress sufficient to cause her to need medical assistance.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

1. A Restraining Order that the Defendant whether by herself or through her agents do not:

- 1.1 Assault, batter, harass or molest the Plaintiff;
- 1.2 Enter or attempt to enter the Plaintiff's home and garden at 110; Yellowstone Road, Newland, Grand Cayman.
2. Damages to be assessed for assault, battery and harassment.
3. Cost of and occasioned by this application.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE OF WRIT OF SUMMONS

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a Defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words of "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his Defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a Stay of Execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words “sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)”.
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “Partner in the firm of (.....)” after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “trading as (.....)” after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a Limited Company the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
