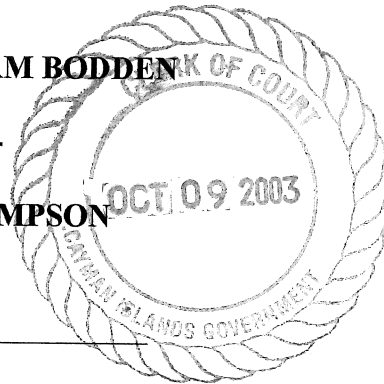

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495 GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE: This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issued unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a Caymanian and resides in South Sound, Grand Cayman.
2. The Defendant is a Caymanian and resides in George Town, Grand Cayman.
3. On or about the 18th of August 2001 at approximately 4 am the Plaintiff was a front seat passenger in a Volkswagen Beetle car, registration number 76651, which was being driven by the Defendant. The Plaintiff was wearing his seatbelt. The vehicle was traveling along South Sound Road heading west when the Defendant lost control of the vehicle as he was going around a curve in the road. The vehicle then collided twice with a guard wall before coming to rest. Due to the damage to the vehicle the Plaintiff had to be removed from the vehicle by the Fire Department. He was subsequently transported by Ambulance to George Town Hospital.
4. The said accident was caused by the Defendant's negligence and or breach of statutory duty under Sections 59 and 60 of the Traffic Law (2001 Revision).

PARTICULARS

The Defendant was negligent and is guilty of breaches of the said statutory duties by:

- a) Failure to exercise due care and attention when using the road and to have due regard to the safety and comfort of other road users and the preservation and protection of public and private property;
- b) Failed to drive in such a manner to have full control of the vehicle at all times;
- c) Driving at a speed which was too fast in the circumstances;
- d) Failing to keep any, or any proper look-out;
- e) Failed to comply with the signs and signals on the road;
- f) Losing control of the vehicle so that it left the road and crashed;
- g) The Plaintiff will rely upon the maxim *Res Ipsa Loquitur*.

5. Further the Plaintiff intends in reliance on section 39 of the Evidence Law (1995 Revision) to adduce evidence at trial that the Defendant was on the 18th of December 2001 convicted of Dangerous Driving (Speed) in respect of his driving on the occasion of the said accident, as evidence of his negligence.
6. By reason of the Defendant's negligence and breach of duty the Plaintiff has suffered loss and damage.

PARTICULARS OF INJURIES

The Plaintiff suffered very serious multiple injuries as a result of the accident and continues to suffer as a result of the injuries sustained. These injuries include:

- (a) Head:
 - i. Concussion to the brain;
 - ii. Memory Loss
 - iii. Headaches
 - iv. Mood Disorder/Anxiety/Depression
 - v. Multiple abrasions and lacerations to the face;
 - vi. Scarring across his right eye;
 - vii. Vision impairment;
- (b) Left Arm/Hand
 - i. Compound fracture
 - ii. Severe Scarring – 7 inch and 6 inch scars
 - iii. Nerve Damage
 - iv. Muscle wasting in left forearm and hand
 - v. Loss of function in left (dominant) arm and hand
- (c) Four Fractured ribs;
- (d) Severe scarring to his left leg – 12 inch;
- (e) Extensive soft tissue injuries, cuts and abrasions. Discomfort and pain in his left shoulder and lower back.

On August 19th, 2001 the Plaintiff underwent surgery to repair the bones in his left arm. Despite the bones having healed he has significant wasting of the small muscle in his left hand and suffers from nerve damage. The extent of this nerve damage is presently unknown and the Plaintiff is seeking further treatment to determine the extent of this and his other injuries. It appears likely that the Plaintiff's injury to his left forearm will leave him with a permanent and significant disability. The extent to which he will be able to recover to his other

injuries is also presently unknown. Further and better particulars of the Plaintiff's injuries will be provided at trial.


PARTICULARS OF SPECIAL DAMAGES

The Plaintiff has incurred and continues to incur medical expenses and loss of income as a result of the accident. The Plaintiff faces substantial future medical expenses, which are still being assessed. Full particulars of the Plaintiff's special damages and losses, which are continuing, will be provided prior to trial by means of a separate schedule.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS

- (1) Damages;
- (2) Pre-Judgment interest in accordance with Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision);
- (3) Post-Judgment interest in accordance with Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995 Revision);
- (4) Costs;
- (5) Such further and other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgement of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2). The defence must be served within fourteen (14) days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until fourteen (14) days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for fourteen (14) days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of fourteen (14) days for acknowledging service, a Writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an Attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorized to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further steps in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL HEALTH PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
