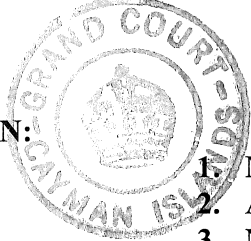

WRIT OF SUMMONS

TO: The Attorney General of the Cayman Islands Attorney General's Chambers, P.O. Box 907GT, George Town, Glass House, Elgin Avenue, Grand Cayman.

**THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS** has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff's in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within **14** days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

**NOTE** - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

## INDORSEMENT

1. The Plaintiffs claims arises out of their unlawful detention by the Attorney General and/or his servants and/or agents on dates between 22nd August 2000 to 28th May 2001 further and/or alternatively between 6<sup>th</sup> December 2000 and 28<sup>th</sup> May 2001 and additionally from 13th September 2001 to 9 October 2001 **AND** for continuing unlawful detention being unlawful curfew and reporting conditions together with unlawful restrictions on movement and liberty **AND** the Plaintiffs seek compensatory damages for such unlawful detention including damages for loss of reputation and injury to feelings.
2. Damages in trespass arising out of unlawful searches and seizures conducted on or about 13<sup>th</sup> September 2001, 19<sup>th</sup> October 2001 and further on or about 26<sup>th</sup> March 2003 by the Enforcement Section of the Cayman Islands Immigration Department being the servants and/or agents of the Defendant

**AND THE Plaintiffs claim:**

1. Damages
2. Interest pursuant to the Judicature Law in such amounts and for such periods as the Court deems just.
3. Costs
4. Further and/or other relief
