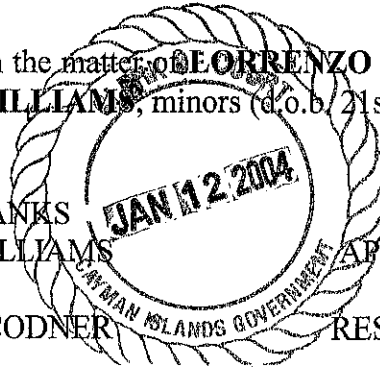

EX PARTE ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE APPLICANTS attend before a Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 3rd day of February 2004, at 9:30'clock on the hearing of an application by the Applicants for the following orders:-

1. That the Minors Lorenzo Jermame Williams and Mandessa Marissa Williams be made Wards of this Honourable Court until further order.
2. That the Applicants be granted interim residence order of the said Minors Lorenzo Jermame Williams and Mandessa Marissa Williams until further order of this Court.
3. That the Respondent do have liberal access to the said Minors as this Court shall deem fit and just in all the circumstances.
4. That there be welfare reports for an assessment as to what would be in the best interest of the Minors regarding their upbringing.
5. That Mandessa Marissa Williams continues to live with the First Applicant, Edna Veronica Ebanks at 180 Powery Road, West Bay, Grand Cayman and that she continues to attend the John A. Cumber Primary School in West Bay, Grand Cayman until further order of this Honourable Court.

6. That Lorenzo Jermaine Williams continues to live with his father, the Second Applicant herein at 5 Barrett Street, Spanish Town, St. Catherine, Jamaica and that he continues to attend school in Jamaica until further order of this Honourable Court.
7. That the Respondent signs the necessary forms to enable the Minors to obtain new passports and United States visas.
8. That there be further orders, as the Court deems just and equitable in the circumstances.

AND LET THE RESPONDENT within 14 days after service of this summons on her counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

**NOTES:-**

- (1) This Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the above date unless renewed by order of the Court.
- (2) If a defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place above-mentioned such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.


Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.
