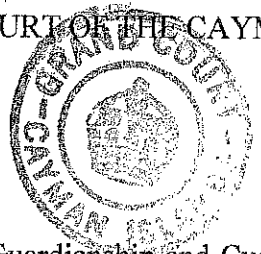

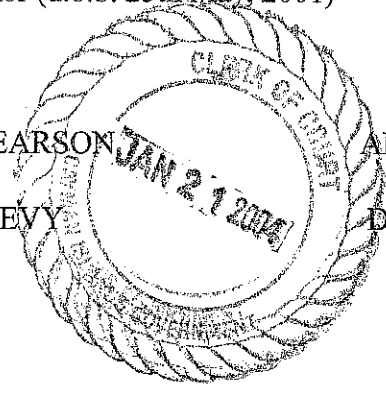

EX PARTE ORIGINATING SUMMONS


LET ALL PARTIES CONCERNED attend before a Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 3rd day of February 2004, at 9:30'clock on the hearing of an application by the Applicants for the following orders:-

1. That the Minor Anna Marian Scott be made Ward of this Honourable Court until further order.
2. That the Applicants be granted interim full custody, care and control of the said Minor until further order of this Court.
3. That the Defendant whether by himself, his servants, agents or otherwise is hereby restrained until further order of this Court from harassing, molesting, assaulting or otherwise interfering with or accosting the Applicants.
4. That the Defendant be restrained from attending within 100 yards of the residence of the Applicants located at No. 10 Xrystal Rocks Apartment, 168B Selkirk Drive, Prospect, Grand Cayman.

5. That there be social inquiry reports by the Social Services Department for an assessment as to what would be in the best interest of the Minor regarding her upbringing.
6. That the Minor continues to live with the Applicants and the Minor's mother, at No. 10 Xrystal Rocks Apartment, 168B Selkirk Drive, Prospect, Grand Cayman, until further order of this Honourable Court.
7. That there be further orders, as the Court deems just and equitable in the circumstances.

AND LET THE Defendant within 14 days after service of this summons on her counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

- (1) This Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the above date unless renewed by order of the Court.
- (2) If a defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place above-mentioned such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.
