



## **STATEMENT OF CLAIM**


1. The Plaintiffs ("A & C Construction") are licensed to carrying on the business of a construction within the Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendants were at all material times customers of A & C Construction.
3. The Defendants entered into an agreement with A & C Construction to perform substantial construction works at a Beauty Salon, V.I.P Beauty Salon, located at all material times in Micro Centre in the Industrial Park area of George Town, Grand Cayman for the value of CI\$12,350.00.
4. A & C Construction completed all scheduled works at V.I.P Beauty Salon and the Defendants are therefore indebted to A & C Construction for CI\$12,350.00
5. Despite numerous demands by A & C Construction to the Defendants for payment of the CI\$12,350.00, the Defendants have either failed/neglected/refused to settle their indebtedness of CI\$12,350.00 with A & C Construction.
6. A & C Construction has made numerous demands of the Defendants to pay the CI\$12,350.00, but the Defendants have failed/neglected/refused to repay the sums outstanding or any part of it.

### **AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS AGAINST THE DEFENDANT:-**

1. Payment of the said sum of CI\$12,350.00.
2. Interest on the said sum of CI\$12,350.00 pursuant to the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) or at such other rate as may be prescribed under the said Law from the date hereof to the date of judgment or sooner payment.
3. Fixed costs in the sum of CI\$500.00 together with the fees payable for issuing this Writ in the sum of CI\$150.00.
4. Any further or other relief as this Honourable Court may deem just.

[If within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of [amount] Cents Cayman Islands Dollars (CI\$13,000.00) plus interest and costs, then further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff.]

**Notes on address for service**

**Attorney:** Where the Defendant is represented by an Attorney, state the Attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by foreign Attorney.

**Defendant in person:** Where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.

**DIRECTION FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of **Acknowledgement of Service** should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgement of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings **must also serve a defence** on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is endorsed on the Writ (ie. The words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If a Statement of Claim is not endorsed on the Writ, the defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. **A Stay of Execution** against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgement of Service, that he intends to apply a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgement, but he must, within that time, **issue a Summons** for a stay of execution, supported by affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for the payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

## Notes for guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)".
4. Where the Defendant is a firm and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....) after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....) after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the company, but the company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a **guardian ad litem**.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
