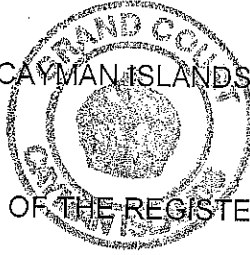

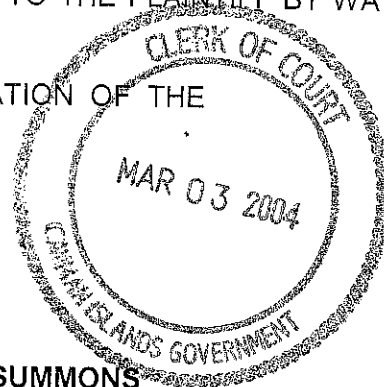

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

LET THE FIRST DEFENDANT of Her Majesty's Prison, Northward, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands and THE SECOND DEFENDANT of P.O. Box 380SAV, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands attend before a Judge in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman, on the 21st day of April 2004, at 9:30^{am} o'clock in the noon, on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff of FirstCaribbean House, 25 Main Street, PO Box 1321 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, for orders and directions as follows:-


1. That this Honourable Court sanction the variation and/or addition permitting the Plaintiff to rely upon the terms contained in the charge made by the Defendants in favour of the Plaintiff dated 9 April 1997 and registered in the Land Registry on 11 June 1997 ("the Charge") over Registration Section Cayman Brac Central, Block 101C, Parcel 15 ("the Property") including the power contained in Clause 19(c) being the power to sell by private treaty;
2. That this Honourable Court sanction the variation and/or addition permitting the Plaintiff to foreclose or enter into possession of the charged premises contained in Clause 19(b) of the Charge;
3. That the Property be listed for sale at CI\$70,000.00.

That a secret reserve price of CI\$60,000.00 be applied to the sale of the Property.

5. That after a sufficient time to market the Property has passed without a sale having occurred the Plaintiff is at liberty to apply to vary this Order by reducing the secret reserve price; and
6. That the Plaintiff be awarded the costs of this application from the proceeds of sale of the Property.

AND LET THE DEFENDANTS within 14 days after service of this Summons on them counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office, PO Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendants are represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.



DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE

OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, an Originating Summons served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
