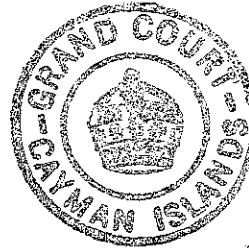

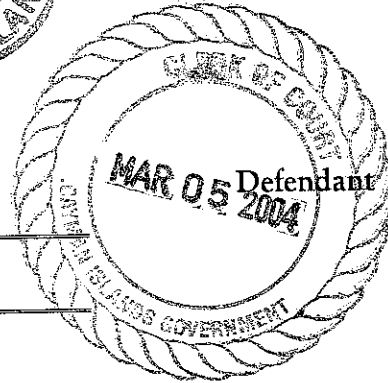

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 5 March 2004

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a company established under the laws of the Cayman Islands and has its registered office c/o Huntlaw Corporate Services PO Box 190 GT, Grand Cayman. The Plaintiff's address for service in connection with this proceeding is in care of its attorneys, Hunter & Hunter, P.O. Box 190 GT, Grand Cayman.
2. The Defendant is an individual residing in the Cayman Islands who at all material times was a parent requesting and obtaining school and ancillary services from the Plaintiff. Her address for service is P.O. Box 2089 GT, Grand Cayman.
3. In or about August 2003, the Plaintiff and the Defendant entered into an agreement whereby the Plaintiff agreed to provide school and ancillary services to the Defendant for the benefit of her son, Reuben Powell, for the school term commencing September 2003. The terms of the agreement were as follows:
 - a. The Plaintiff would be paid in the sum of \$950 per month on the first day of each month commencing September 2003;
 - b. The Defendant would pay the Plaintiff further expenses for lunches and uniforms as ordered from time to time by the Defendant for her son;
 - c. Interest on unpaid accounts would accrue at the rate of 1% per month (or 12% per year);
 - d. The Defendant would pay the legal expenses of the Plaintiff in the event that the Defendant failed to make payments in accordance with the agreement;
4. The Plaintiff did provide school services from September through to December 16, 2003 including tuition and lunches to the Defendant on behalf of her child and invoices were rendered for such services and product as set out below and for which no payment was received:-



5. The Defendant has been unable or unwilling to make payments on the above accounts notwithstanding numerous requests made by the Plaintiff for her to do so, such requests occurring prior to the instruction of attorneys to pursue the collection of the outstanding debt.
6. A demand letter for payment was served on the Defendant on 16 February 2004 requiring payment to be made within 7 days of the date of service. No response was received from the Defendant following service of the demand letter.

7. The total amount outstanding principal owed by the Defendant to the Plaintiff as of the commencement of this proceeding is \$2,094.50, exclusive of legal fees and interest.
8. The total interest claimed as of the date of the commencement of this proceeding (5 March 2004) is \$54.51 calculated from the date of the last invoice rendered on 16 December 2003.
9. As a result of the above, the Defendant is liable to the Plaintiff in the sums as set out in this Statement of Claim.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- a) CI\$2094.50;
- b) Pre-Judgment interest (service charge), calculated to the commencement of the proceeding (5 March 2004), of CI\$54.51 at the rate of 1% per month (12% per year) in accordance with the agreement pleaded in the Statement of Claim at paragraph 3(c) above;
- c) Costs on an indemnity basis in accordance with the agreement pleaded at paragraph 3(d) in the Statement of Claim or, alternatively, standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001;
- d) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just;

INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$2,094.50, plus interest as of the date of commencement of the proceeding is CI\$54.51 and court costs and attorney fees of \$500 on an indemnity basis as in accordance with the agreement pleaded at 3(d). The amount of the filing fees to commence the proceeding is CI\$150.00. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the Defendant pays the Plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal, interest, attorney fees and the costs of issuing the writ of summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff's attorneys-at-law.

INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

(Order 6 (2)(e) of the Grand Court Rules)

- i. The contractual term upon which interest is 1% per month (12% per year) as pleaded in paragraph 3(c) of the Statement of Claim, above.
- ii. The prescribed rate of interest during the entire relevant period is 1% per month (12% per year);
- iii. The date from which interest runs is the date of the last invoice rendered being 16 December 2003.
- iv. The total interest claimed as at the date of the issue of the writ of summons is CI\$54.51.
- v. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of the writ of summons is CI\$0.69 per day;

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendants.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If A Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
