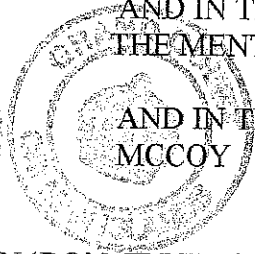

ORIGINATING SUMMONS



LET THE RESPONDENT attend before a Judge of the Grand Court in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 20th day of May 2004 at 9:30^o clock in the forenoon on the hearing of an application on behalf of the Applicants for the following orders and other relief:-

1. That the Applicants , Derrington 'Bo' Miller & Rhonda Benjamin be appointed guardians for the said Exford Mellino McCoy ('the patient') and over his estate and effects with the following powers conferred upon them
 - a) to control and manage the property of the patient.
 - b) to deposit into and withdraw from any account at any bank or lending institution in the Cayman Islands and elsewhere such of the patient's monies as may be necessary for the proper maintenance and care of the patient.

2. That the Applicants be appointed Receivers in relation to the administration of the estate of the patient.
3. That the Applicants shall keep proper accounts of the administration and management of the property of the patient and whenever required by the Court to do so shall file in Court copies of such accounts.
5. That the cost of this application and the cost of the guardian and receiver incidental to and consequent upon the Order shall be paid from the estate and property of the patient.
6. That there be liberty to apply.

NOTE: (1) This Summons must not be served later than 4 months beginning with the above date unless renewed by the Court.

(2) If a Respondent does not attend personally or by his Attorney-at-law at the time and place above-mentioned such Order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.
