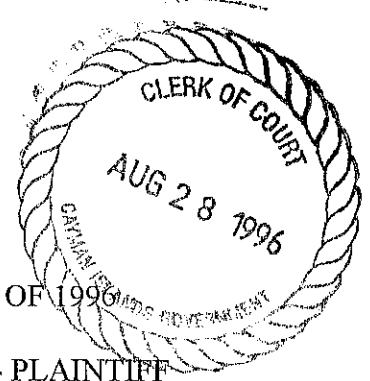

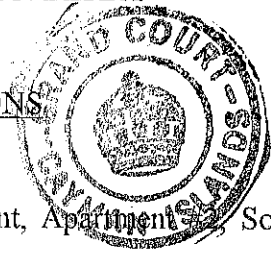

WRIT OF SUMMONS



TO: George Overton Berry at Biggie's Apartment, Apartment 2, Sound Road George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, BWI.

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 28 day of August 1996.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. On 7 December 1995 the Defendant, by his promissory note, promised to pay to the Plaintiff CI\$3986.00 in the following manner, namely CI\$371.00 per month until the whole of the said sum was fully paid.
2. The Defendant made default in payment of the first of the said installments, and on 8 December 1995 only paid CI\$150.00. The sum remaining unpaid was CI\$3836.00.
3. The Defendant has not paid the said CI\$3836.00 or any part thereof.

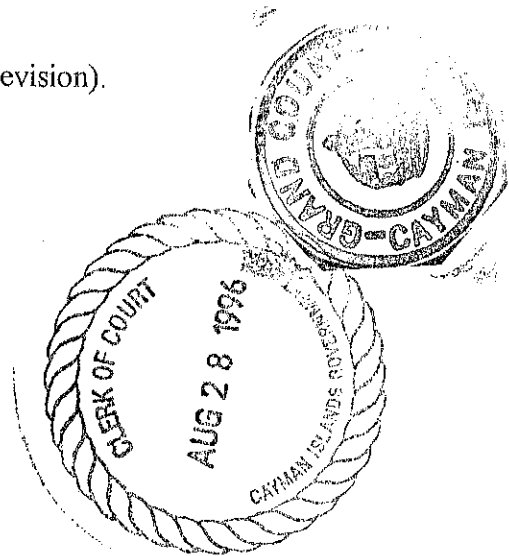

3. Costs.

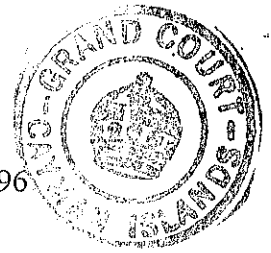
