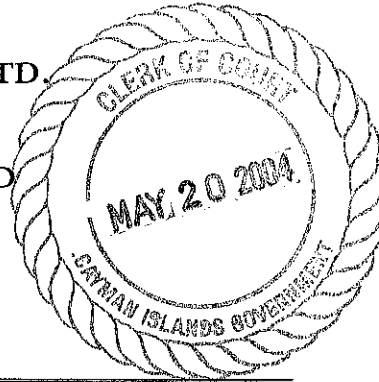

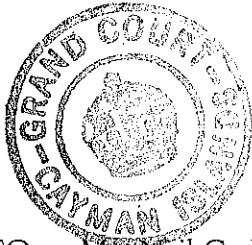

WRIT OF SUMMONS

TO: Mr. Neil Carle

Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 19 May 2004

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is and was at all material times a Class A bank carrying on the business of retail banking in the Cayman Islands with its registered office located at P.O. Box 914 GT., Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant is an individual residing in the Cayman Islands with a mailing address of P.O. Box 194 GT, Grand Cayman. At all material times the Defendant was a customer of the Plaintiff.

Card # 1 – Account #5440-4301-1200-3815

3. The Defendant entered into a credit card agreement with the Plaintiff for a Mastercard credit card (the “Agreement”). The Agreement included the following terms:
 - (a) The Plaintiff would advance credit to the Defendant;
 - (b) Defendant would repay a minimum amount of 5% per month;
 - (c) Interest would accrue on unpaid balances at the rate of 18% per annum; and
 - (d) The Defendant would be liable for the costs of the Plaintiff on an indemnity basis arising from or relating to legal steps required to obtain repayment in the event that the Defendant defaulted on the payment terms.
4. The Defendant did default on the terms of payment and as of the date of the commencement of this proceeding, 19 May 2004, the Defendant owed to the Plaintiff the sum of US\$6,334.92 (plus interest of US\$304.18). Interest continues to accrue under the Agreement at the rate of US\$3.19 per day from 20 May 2004.

Bancard – Credit Card # 2 – Account #5886-2001-1148-0000

5. The Defendant also entered into an agreement with the Plaintiff for a Bancard credit card (“Bancard Agreement”). The Bancard Agreement included the following terms:
 - (a) Plaintiff would advance credit to the Defendant;
 - (b) Defendant would repay a minimum amount of 5% per month;
 - (c) Interest would accrue on unpaid balances at the rate of 24% per annum; and
 - (d) The Defendant would be liable for the Plaintiff’s legal costs on an indemnity basis arising from or relating to legal steps required to obtain repayment in the event that the Defendant defaulted on the payment terms.
6. The Defendant did default on the terms of payment and as of the date of the commencement of this proceeding, 19 May 2004, the Defendant owed to the Plaintiff

the sum of CI\$1,958.16 (plus interest of CI\$427.05). Interest continues to accrue under the Bancard Agreement at the rate of CI\$1.48 per day from 20 May 2004.

7. Notwithstanding demands for payment by the Plaintiff, the Defendant was either unable or unwilling to make payments to the Plaintiff in respect of indebtedness under the Agreement or the Bancard Agreement.
8. As a result of the above, the Plaintiff is entitled to the relief claimed in this proceeding.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:


Credit Card # 1

- (a) US\$6,334.92 being the total sum of a Mastercard credit card principal due to by the Plaintiff as at 19 May 2004;
- (b) Pre judgment interest of US\$304.18 to 19 May 2004;
- (c) Pre and post judgment interest at the rate of 18% in accordance with the Agreement;
- (d) Alternatively, pre and post-judgment interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time;
- (e) Costs on an indemnity basis, in accordance with contractual terms pleaded at 3(d) above, and following the issuance of the Writ of Summons, such costs to be taxed if not agreed;
- (f) Alternatively, costs on an indemnity basis or standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001; and
- (g) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just.

Credit Card # 2

- (a) CI\$1,958.16 being the total sum of a Bancard credit card principal due to the Plaintiff as at 19 May 2004;
- (b) Pre judgment interest of CI\$427.05 to 19 May 2004;
- (c) Pre and post judgment interest at the rate of 24% in accordance with the Agreement;

- (d) Alternatively, pre and post-judgment interest in accordance with the Judicature Law (1995 Revision) and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time;
- (e) Costs on an indemnity basis, in accordance with contractual terms pleaded at 5(d) above, and following the issuance of the Writ of Summons, such costs to be taxed if not agreed;
- (f) Alternatively, costs on an indemnity basis or standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001; and.
- (g) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just.

INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of credit card # 1 debt is US\$6,639.00 including interest as of the date of filing contractually due to the Plaintiff, and the principal amount claimed in respect of credit card # 2 debt is CI\$2,385.21 including interest as of the date of filing due to the Plaintiff. If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the plaintiff or its Attorneys-at-Law the total amount claimed in principal, interest, contractual costs and the costs (as set out in paragraph 6 of the Statement of Claim) of issuing the writ of summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or to its Attorneys-at-Law.

INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

(Order 6 (2)(e) of the Grand Court Rules)

Credit Card # 1

1. The contractual term upon which interest is claimed is as set out in paragraph 3(c) of the Statement of Claim above.
2. The prescribed rate of interest during the entire relevant period is 18% per year.
3. The interest claimed as at the date of the issue of the writ of summons is US\$304.18.
4. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of the writ of summons is US\$3.19.

Credit Card # 2

5. The contractual term upon which interest is claimed is as set out in paragraph 5(c), of the Statement of Claim above.
6. The prescribed rate of interest during the entire relevant period is 24% per year.
7. The interest claimed as at the date of the issue of the Writ of Summons is CI\$427.05.
8. The amount of interest accruing each day following the issue of the writ of summons is CI\$1.48.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If A Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
