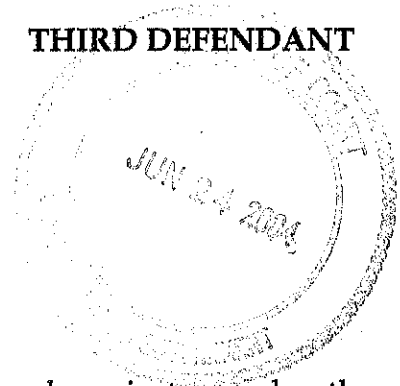

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a Legal Firm with Law Offices situated at George Town, Grand Cayman.
2. In or about April 2003 the Plaintiff was instructed by the Second Defendant to defend the First Defendant in an action before the Grand Court Cause No. 268 of 2003. At the time of the instructions the Second Defendant represented to the Plaintiff that he was the owner of the Third Defendant and warranted to the Plaintiff that the Third Defendant would pay the Plaintiff legal charges on presentation of the Plaintiff's legal charges to the Third Defendant.
3. Further, on or about October 2003 the Second Defendant instructed the Plaintiff to provide certain legal services for the Third Defendant and warranted to the Plaintiff that the Third Defendant would pay the Plaintiff on presentation of the Plaintiff's legal charges to the Third Defendant.
4. Between April 2003 to March 2004 the Plaintiff provided legal and professional service to the First and to the Third Defendant pursuant to the said instructions and warranties of the Second Defendant.
5. On several occasions the Plaintiff presented up to date legal charges for work performed and was paid by the Third Defendant.
6. On the 7th day of June 2004 the Plaintiff presented a final billing for legal charges to the Third Defendant. The Third Defendant, the First Defendant and the Second Defendant refuse to pay the Plaintiff's said outstanding bill for legal charges.

7. The Plaintiff's said outstanding legal charges in the amount of CI\$ 6,940.00 remain due and owing by the Defendants.
8. In the premises the Defendants are severally and jointly liable to the Plaintiff for the payment of the sum of CI\$6,940.00 representing outstanding monies due and owing to the Plaintiff of the said billing dated 7th June 2004.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. Against the Defendants severally and jointly the sum of CI\$6,940.00;
2. Interest on the said sum pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (1995) Revision;
3. Cost.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$6,940.00 (including interest and costs) further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiffs or their Attorneys.
