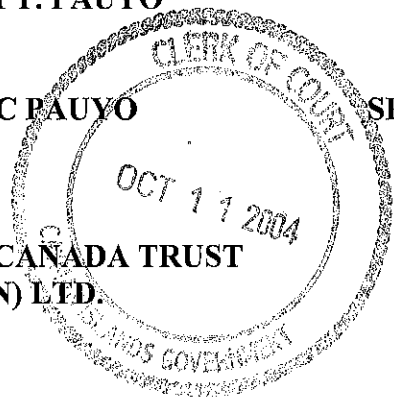


BY THIS SUMMONS which is issued on application of the Plaintiff, Joelle Gabryjonczyk of Runebergsg, 1, IV, 114 29 Stockholm, Sweden, the Plaintiff claims the following declarations from the Honourable Court:-

1. That the correspondence between the Plaintiff, the First Defendant and the Third Defendant from 19th December 2003 to 26 February 2004, constitutes a valid and

binding contract between the Third Defendant on the one hand, and First Defendant, the Second Defendant and the Plaintiff on the other

2. That the Third Defendant's Grand Cayman Mandate represents the terms and conditions of the contract referred to in the above paragraph.
3. That the actions of the Third Defendant in removing the Plaintiff as a signatory from Account (number 747478) held in the Cayman Islands' branch constitutes a breach of clause 8 of the Third Defendant's mandate.
4. Any further relief this Honourable Court may deem appropriate.
5. That the Courts of this summons be payable by Defendants.
