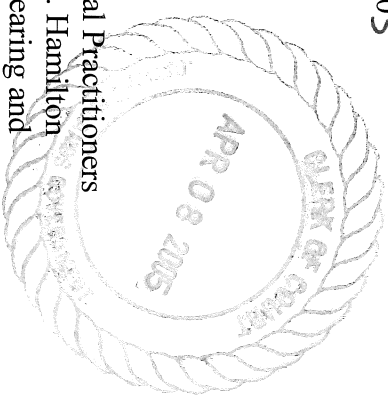

TEMPORARY WORK PERMIT APPLICATION

Notes:

- This form must be completed in duplicate.
- Applications submitted to the Immigration Department by 2pm will be processed and the decision will be ready or collection at 10.00am on the following morning.
- If the prospective employee is not a national of an English speaking country they must come to the Immigration Department with their employer when the decision is being collected at or after 10.00am on the following morning where such an employee is not yet in the Cayman Islands, and they are found upon arrival not to possess a sufficient knowledge of the English language, they will be refused entry.
- Temporary Work Permits are valid for periods of up to six months at the discretion of the Chief Immigration Officer.
- Temporary Work Permits may be granted for any category of occupation.
- All fees must be paid at time of application. (See fee schedule, available separately).
- Persons not already residing in the Islands are required to provide a police clearance
- The normal requirements concerning medicals are waived at present. However, the Chief Immigration Officer reserves the right to require any prospective employee to undertake a medical, including HIVVDRL tests, if he deems it appropriate.

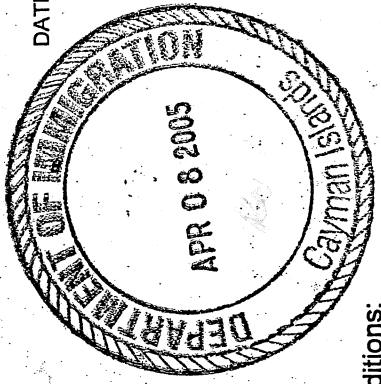
