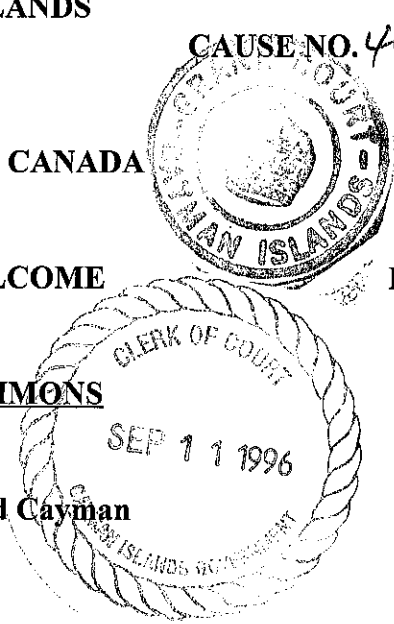

WRIT OF SUMMONS

TO: Joseph B. Welcome, East End, Grand Cayman



THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

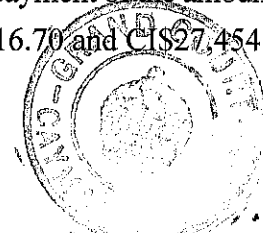
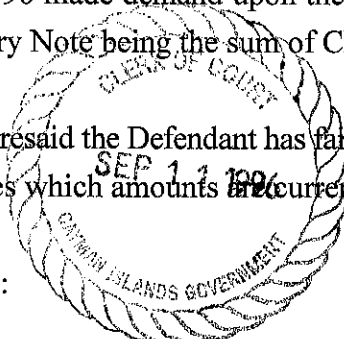

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. Pursuant to a Promissory Note dated 18th August 1995 the Defendant agreed to repay to the Plaintiff the sum of CI\$31,500.00 together with interest thereon on demand. Pending such demand the Defendant agreed to repay the outstanding sum by monthly instalments.
2. The Defendant failed to maintain payment of the said monthly instalments and the Plaintiff by a letter dated 17th July 1996 made demand upon the Defendant for the full amount due and owing under the Promissory Note being the sum of CI\$31,816.70.
3. Pursuant to a further Promissory Note dated 12th October 1995 the Defendant agreed to repay to the Plaintiff the sum of CI\$35,000.00 together with interest thereon on demand. Pending such demand the Defendant agreed to repay the outstanding sum by monthly instalments.
4. The Defendant failed to maintain payment of the said monthly instalments and the Plaintiff by a letter dated 17th July 1996 made demand upon the Defendant for the full amount due and owing under the Promissory Note being the sum of CI\$28,111.70.
5. Despite the demands as aforesaid the Defendant has failed to make payment of the amounts due under the Promissory Notes which amounts are currently CI\$31,816.70 and CI\$27,454.62.



AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. The said sum of CI\$59,271.32.
2. Interest pursuant to Section 34 (1) of The Judicature Law (1995 Revision) at 7 3/8% per annum at a daily rate of CI\$11.98 per day.
3. Costs.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$59,271.32 and CI\$1,092.71 respect of costs and fees further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or its Attorney.
