

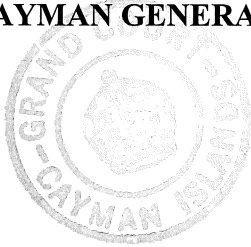

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out in the attached Statement of Claim:

Within 14 days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form stating therein whether you intend to contest the proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or fail to return the Acknowledgement of Service within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you, without any further notice to you.

Issued the 5th day of May, 2005.

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.



GENERAL ENDORSMENT

1. The Plaintiff as a body corporate established under and by virtue of the Health Services Authority Law 2003 (Revision) claims against the Defendant, an approved provider licensed as an insurer under the Insurance Law 2002 (Revision) to provide standard health insurance contracts the sum of CI\$791,966.44 being the amount of claims made by the Plaintiff due to a Health Care Facility established and operated by the Plaintiff to which said claims the Defendant has wrongfully refused to respond, process or pay.
2. Further and or alternatively, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendant the said sum of CI\$791, 966.44 as damages for breach of contract and or breach of statutory duty, by the Defendant.
3. Interest on any amount found to be due to the Defendant under the provisions of the Health Insurance Regulations 2002 and the 2004 amendment thereto and pursuant to section 34 of The Judicature Law and the Grand Court Rules 1995.
4. Costs
5. Further or other relief that seem just.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed CI\$791,966.44, and interest and costs further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff and or his Attorney-at-Law.
