ORIGINATING SUMMONS




LET THE RESPONDENT of Berry Drive, Mahogany Estates, Grand Cayman attend before the Judge in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2005, at o'clock on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff of Berry Drive, Grand Cayman that:

- (1) The Defendant be restrained and enjoined from preventing the Plaintiff from entering and having the use and enjoyment of the room and facilities rented by him at Berry Drive, Mahogany Estates, Grand Cayman until further order of the court.
- (2) The Defendant be ordered to ensure that the Plaintiff has access to the said room.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within fourteen (14) days of this Summons on her counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**


The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P. O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

**Notes for Guidance**


1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

NOTICE TO BE INDORSED ON COPY OF COUNTERCLAIM

TAKE NOTICE that, within [14 days] after service of this defence and counterclaim on you, counting the day of service, you must acknowledge service and state in your acknowledgment whether you intend to contest the proceedings. If you fail to do so or if your acknowledgment does not state your intention to contest the proceedings, judgment may be given against you without further notice.

Information to contest the proceedings, if given, may be
