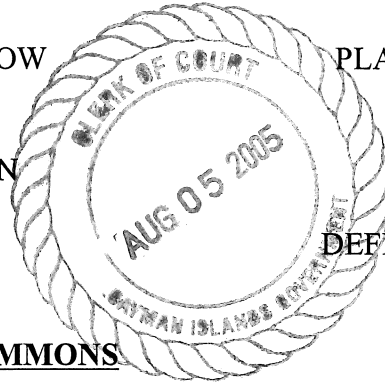
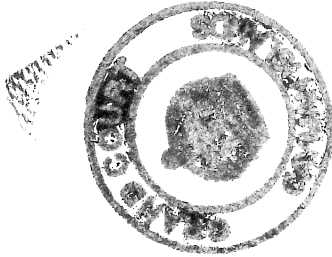

**WRIT OF SUMMONS**

TO: Dr. Richard Vernon of P.O. Box 30334SMB, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within **[14 days]** after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 5th day of August 2005.

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (*or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months*) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

### **STATEMENT OF CLAIM**

1. For many years until April, 2004, the Plaintiffs owned and operated a dental practice in Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands. The Defendant was employed by the Plaintiffs as a dentist.
2. In April, 2004 the parties entered into an Agreement (“the Agreement”) pursuant to which the Defendant purchased the Plaintiffs’ dental practice in Grand Cayman. The total purchase price was CI\$180,000. This sum represented CI\$160,000 for goodwill and CI\$20,000 for the equipment of the business.
3. At the time that the parties entered into the Agreement, the Defendant paid the sum of CI\$5,000 towards the equipment. The Defendant paid the balance for the equipment of CI\$15,000 on 27<sup>th</sup> July, 2004. It was agreed that the remainder of the purchase price would be paid by monthly instalments over a period of 3 years from 1 June, 2004 at the rate of CI\$4,444.44 per calendar month.
4. Since the Agreement, the Defendant has had sole responsibility for all managerial decisions relating to the dental practice and, consistent with his ownership of the business, has not accounted to the Plaintiffs for any profits of the business.
5. In breach of contract, the Defendant has not paid any instalment payments since that due on 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2004. At present he is therefore 12 months in arrears, which arrears presently total CI\$53,333.28.
6. Furthermore the Plaintiffs claim interest on the outstanding amounts from the date that each sum became due pursuant to the Judicature Law at the relevant applicable interest rate.

AND THE PLAINTIFFS claim:-

1. The sum of CI\$53,333.28 in respect of unpaid instalments together with any further amounts due and payable at the date of judgment.
2. Interest.
3. Costs.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of 53,333.28 plus costs of CI\$1083.33 further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or his Attorney.

**Notes on address for service**

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence o, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.

**Acknowledgement of service of Writ of Summons (O.12, r.3)**

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve a defence on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A Stay of Execution against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, issue a Summons for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words “sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)”.
4. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “Partner in the firm of (.....)” after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “trading as (.....)” after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
